AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to establishing a list of emerging contaminants

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Paragraph c of subdivision 3 of section 1112 of the public health law, as added by section 1 of part M of chapter 57 of the laws of 2017, is amended and a new subdivision 13 is added to read as follows:

c. The commissioner shall, at a minimum, include the following chemicals identified as emerging contaminants in the first list of emerging contaminants: 1,2,3-trichloropropane; 1,3-butadiene; chloromethane (methyl chloride); 1,1-dichloroethane; bromomethane (methyl bromide); chlorodifluoromethene (HCFC-22); bromochloromethane (halon 1011); 1,4-dioxane; vanadium; molybdenum; cobalt; strontium; chromium; chromium-6; chlorate; perfluorooctanesulfonic acid (PFOS); [and] perfluorooctanoic acid (PFOA); perfluorononanoic acid (PFNA); perfluorohexanesulfonic acid (PFHxS); perfluoroheptanoic acid (PFHpA); perfluorobutanesulfonic acid (PFBS); hexafluoropropylene oxide (HFPO); 2,3,3,3-tetrafluoro-2- (heptafluoropropoxy) propanoic acid; 2,3,3,3-tetrafluoro-2- (heptafluoropropoxy) propanoate; heptafluoropropyl 1,2,2,2-tetrafluoroethyl ether; testosterone; and 4-androstene-3,17-dione.

13. The commissioner shall promulgate the first list of emerging contaminants within thirty days of the effective date of this subdivision.

§ 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
