AN ACT to amend the education law, the public health law and the civil practice law and rules, in relation to requiring applicants for certain nursing licenses and certifications to complete training in the prevention of human trafficking

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 305 of the education law is amended by adding a new subdivision 59 to read as follows:

3 59. The commissioner shall consult and collaborate with the commissioner of health and appropriate organizations that have expertise in 4 the prevention of human trafficking, as well as other interested 5 б parties, to establish and develop training within the department related 7 to noticing signs and evidence of, and the prevention of, human traf-8 ficking. Such training shall be defined by the commissioner in requ-9 lations after consultation with the department of health and be designed 10 to educate those seeking the license or certification of registered professional nurse, licensed practical nurse, certified nurse practi-11 12 tioner, and clinical nurse specialist. The training shall be defined and 13 ready for usage by license or certification applicants no later than 14 three years after the effective date of this subdivision. 15 § 2.
