AN ACT to amend the public authorities law and the transportation law, in relation to extending and expanding the scope of the on-demand E-hail paratransit pilot

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 3 of section 1205 of the public authorities 2 law, as added by chapter 717 of the laws of 1967, is amended and a new 3 subdivision 9 is added to read as follows:

3. Notwithstanding the provisions of subdivision one of this section, 4 5 no zonal system of fares proposed to be instituted on or after March first, nineteen hundred sixty-eight for the use of the whole or any part 6 7 of a rapid transit facility or of an omnibus line facility or a para-8 transit service operated by the authority and no general revision of the 9 system of transfers applicable to the use of all such facilities in 10 effect as of that date shall be established without the written approval 11 of the mayor. For the purposes of this subdivision the term "zonal system of fares" shall mean any system whereby the fare payable for the 12 13 use of a rapid transit facility or an omnibus line facility or any para-14 transit service operated by the authority or of any part thereof varies 15 according to distance traveled or to the location of the point of entry 16 or departure by the user, but the creation or elimination of free trans-17 fer points shall not be regarded as the institution of such a system.

9. a. For purposes of this subdivision, the term "on-demand E-hail paratransit pilot" shall mean the service created by the metropolitan transportation authority in two thousand seventeen, through which users of the authority's Access-A-Ride paratransit program can receive immediate rides using a smartphone app or phone service.

b. The authority shall continue to operate the on-demand E-hail para transit pilot through March thirty-first, two thousand twenty-two, as
provided by subdivision five-a of section fifteen-b of the transporta tion law.

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1	c. Fares for rides for the on-demand E-hail paratransit pilot shall be
2	equal to the authority's base fare for bus and subway services. Hours of
3	service for such pilot shall be the same as the authority's hours of
4	service for bus, subway, and other paratransit services. The length,
5	duration and number of on-demand E-hail paratransit pilot rides avail-
6	able to each user enrolled in the on-demand E-hail paratransit pilot
7	shall not be limited or restricted.
8	§ 2. Section 15-b of the transportation law is amended by adding a new
9	subdivision 5-a to read as follows:
10	5-a. a. For purposes of this subdivision, the term "on-demand E-hail
11	paratransit pilot" shall mean the service created by the metropolitan
12	transportation authority in two thousand seventeen, through which users
13	of the authority's Access-A-Ride paratransit program can receive immedi-
14	<u>ate rides using a smartphone app or phone service.</u>
15	b. The metropolitan transportation authority shall continue to operate
16	the on-demand E-hail paratransit pilot through March thirty-first, two
17	thousand twenty-two.
18	c. On or before March sixteenth, two thousand twenty, the metropolitan
19	transportation authority shall expand the on-demand E-hail paratransit
20	pilot to include an additional one thousand two hundred Access-A-Ride
21	users. In selecting new users for the on-demand E-hail paratransit
22	pilot, the metropolitan transportation authority shall endeavor to
23	select a representative sample of Access-A-Ride users, accounting for
24	age, disability, geographic distribution throughout New York City, and
25	frequency of ridership of Access-A-Ride's other services.
26	d. Fares for rides for the on-demand E-hail paratransit pilot shall be
27	equal to the metropolitan transportation authority's base fare for bus
28	and subway services. Hours of service for such pilot shall be the same
29	as the metropolitan transportation authority's hours of service for bus,
30	subway, and other paratransit services. The length, duration and number
31	of on-demand E-hail paratransit pilot rides available to each user
32	enrolled in the on-demand E-hail paratransit pilot shall not be limited
33	or restricted.
34	e. In order to determine the viability of maintaining and further
35	expanding the on-demand E-hail paratransit pilot, the metropolitan
36	transportation authority shall issue a report to the governor and the
37	legislature on or before April thirtieth, two thousand twenty-one,
38	detailing ridership, usage patterns, and costs of the on-demand E-hail
39	paratransit pilot.
