AN ACT to amend the vehicle and traffic law, in relation to authorizing cities, villages and towns to reduce the speed limit to twenty-five miles per hour

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Section 1643 of the vehicle and traffic law, as amended by  
2 chapter 412 of the laws 2012, is amended to read as follows:  
3 § 1643. Speed limits on highways in cities and villages. The legisla-  
4 tive body of any city or village with respect to highways (which term  
5 for the purposes of this section shall include private roads open to  
6 public motor vehicle traffic) in such city or village, other than state  
7 highways maintained by the state on which the department of transporta-  
8 tion shall have established higher or lower speed limits than the statu-  
9 tory fifty-five miles per hour speed limit as provided in section  
10 sixteen hundred twenty of this title, or on which the department of  
11 transportation shall have designated that such city or village shall not  
12 establish any maximum speed limit as provided in section sixteen hundred  
13 twenty-four of this title, subject to the limitations imposed by section  
14 sixteen hundred eighty-four of this title may by local law, ordinance,  
15 order, rule or regulation establish maximum speed limits at which vehi-  
16 cles may proceed within such city or village, within designated areas of  
17 such city or village or on or along designated highways within such city  
18 or village higher or lower than the fifty-five miles per hour maximum  
19 statutory limit. No such speed limit applicable throughout such city or  
20 village or within designated areas of such city or village shall be  
21 established at less than thirty miles per hour; except that (i) the  
22 legislative body of any city or village may by local law, ordinance,  
23 order, rule or regulation establish a maximum speed limit of twenty-five  
24 miles per hour applicable throughout such city or village, and (ii) in  
25 the city of Long Beach, in the county of Nassau, speed limits may be  
26 established at not less than fifteen miles per hour on any portion of  
27 the following highways in such city: Cleveland avenue, Harding avenue,  
28 Mitchell avenue, Belmont avenue, Atlantic avenue, Coolidge avenue,  
29 Wilson avenue and Taft avenue. No such speed limit applicable on or  
30 along designated highways within such city or village shall be estab-

1 lished at less than twenty-five miles per hour, except that school speed  
2 limits may be established at not less than fifteen miles per hour, for a  
3 distance not to exceed one thousand three hundred twenty feet, on a  
4 highway passing a school building, entrance or exit of a school abutting  
5 on the highway and except that within the cities of Buffalo and Roches-  
6 ter speed limits may be established at not less than fifteen miles per  
7 hour for any portion of a highway within a city park.

8 § 2. Section 1662-a of the vehicle and traffic law, as amended by  
9 chapter 405 of the laws of 2012, is amended to read as follows:

10 § 1662-a. Speed limits in certain towns. The town board of any subur-  
11 ban town governed pursuant to article three-A of the town law and the  
12 town board of any other town having a population exceeding fifty thou-  
13 sand, with respect to highways (which term for the purposes of this  
14 section shall include private roads open to public motor vehicle traf-  
15 fic) in such towns outside any village, other than state highways main-  
16 tained by the state on which the department of transportation shall have  
17 established higher or lower speed limits than the statutory fifty-five  
18 miles per hour speed limit as provided in section sixteen hundred twenty  
19 of this title, or on which the department of transportation shall have  
20 designated that such towns shall not establish any maximum speed limit  
21 as provided in section sixteen hundred twenty-four of this title,  
22 subject to the limitations imposed by section sixteen hundred eighty-  
23 four of this title may by local law, ordinance, order, rule or regu-  
24 lation establish maximum speed limits at which vehicles may proceed  
25 within such towns, within designated areas of such towns or on or along  
26 designated highways within such towns lower than the fifty-five miles  
27 per hour maximum statutory limit. No such speed limit applicable  
28 throughout such towns or within designated areas of such towns shall be  
29 established at less than thirty miles per hour, except that (i) a town  
30 board may by local law, ordinance, order, rule or regulation establish a  
31 maximum speed limit of twenty-five miles per hour applicable throughout  
32 such town and (ii) in the town of Hempstead speed limits may be estab-  
33 lished at not less than fifteen miles per hour on any portion of a high-  
34 way in the community known as Point Lookout and on all or any portion of  
35 the following highways in the community known as Lido Beach: Ocean  
36 Boulevard, Allevard Street, Bath Street, Buxton Street, Cheltenham  
37 Street, Pinehurst Street, Harrogate Street, Matlock Street, Nantwick  
38 Street, Biarritz Street, Royat Street, Luchon Street, Woodhail Street,  
39 Leamington Street, Saratoga Street, Kensington Street, and Prescott  
40 Street; provided, however, that no such speed limit in such town may be  
41 established unless a majority of the residents of each such community  
42 file a petition with the town board of such town requesting such speed  
43 limit. No such speed limit applicable on or along designated highways  
44 within such towns shall be established at less than twenty-five miles  
45 per hour, except that school speed limits may be established at not less  
46 than fifteen miles per hour, for a distance not to exceed one thousand  
47 three hundred twenty feet, on a highway passing a school building,  
48 entrance or exit of a school abutting on the highway, and except further  
49 that in the town of Hempstead speed limits may be established at not  
50 less than fifteen miles per hour on any portion of a highway in the  
51 communities known as Point Lookout and Lido Beach; provided, however,  
52 that no such speed limit in such town may be established unless a major-  
53 ity of the residents of each such community file a petition with the  
54 town board of such town requesting such speed limit.

55 § 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
