AN ACT to require the department of health to conduct a study on the health impacts of COVID-19 on minorities in New York state

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- 1 Section 1. 1. The department of health shall conduct a study on the
2 health impacts of coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) on minorities in
3 New York state. The purpose of the study shall be to:
- 4 (a) identify COVID-19 statewide and regional rates of infection,
5 hospitalization, recovery and mortality and any racial and ethnic
6 disparities in such rates, and medical, non-medical, and system-related
7 factors that may have contributed to such rate disparities;
- 8 (b) review the extent to which racial and ethnic disparities in
9 COVID-19 infection, hospitalization, recovery and mortality rates in a
10 geographic area indicate the need to increase access to health care
11 services in that area; and
- 12 (c) identify ways to reduce or eliminate racial and ethnic disparities
13 that contributed to such disparities in COVID-19 infection, hospitaliza-
14 tion, recovery and mortality rates.
- 15 2. Within one year after the effective date of this act, the depart-
16 ment of health shall prepare and submit to the governor, the temporary
17 president of the senate, the speaker of the assembly, the minority lead-
18 er of the senate and the minority leader of the assembly a report
19 containing the study's findings concerning the rates of COVID-19
20 infection, hospitalization, recovery and mortality and any racial and
21 ethnic disparities in such rates and recommendations for legislative or
22 other actions that can be undertaken to reduce or eliminate racial and
23 ethnic disparities and increase access to health care services in the
24 state.
- 25 § 2. This act take effect immediately.
