- AN ACT to amend the social services law, in relation to requiring the commissioner to prepare a report of the sheltered and unsheltered homeless population during a state disaster emergency

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 17 of the social services law is amended by adding a new subdivision (d-1) to read as follows:

3 (d-1)(1) in consultation with each local health department in the 4 county in which the homeless shelter is located, the commissioner of the 5 department of health, the commissioners of the department of homeless services, and the commissioner of the New York city department of health 6 7 and mental hygiene, shall collect information regarding the sheltered 8 and unsheltered homeless population, during a state disaster emergency, 9 declared pursuant to executive order two hundred two of two thousand 10 twenty in response to the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, including but not limited to: 11 (i) the number of confirmed infected individuals; 12 13 (ii) the number of hospitalizations; 14 (iii) the number of deaths; 15 (iv) information regarding the individual, if known; (a) age; (b) race; (c) family composition; (d) shelter status; (e) type of shelter 16 including: family shelter, a shelter for adults, a hotel, an emergency 17 apartment, a domestic violence shelter, a runaway and homeless youth 18 19 shelter, or as a safe house for refugees; (f) any known risk factors; 20 and (q) any other information the office deems appropriate. 21

(2) utilizing the information collected pursuant to paragraph (1) of this subdivision, the commissioners shall publish a report containing such information aggregated by county and post it on the website of each respective agency.
