AN ACT to amend the public service law, in relation to establishing discount programs for veterans

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. The public service law is amended by adding a new section 66-t to read as follows:

§ 66-t. Utility discount program. 1. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the commission is authorized and directed to require a gas corporation, electric corporation or municipality to establish a discount program for veterans no later than ninety days after the effective date of this section. Such program shall offer a yearly benefit to yeterans in the form of a ten percent discount on utility bills. The fiscal impact of such program shall not be borne by customers and shall 10 not be added to bills rendered by a gas corporation, electric corporation or municipality to customers.

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- 12 (b) A gas corporation, electric corporation or municipality which 13 offers such discount program shall conspicuously advertise the availability and amount of such discount on the website of such gas corpo-15 ration, electric corporation or municipality. The availability and amount of such discount shall also be conspicuously advertised on the 16 accessibility page of the website of such gas corporation, electric 17 18 corporation or municipality.
- 2. (a) For the purposes of this section, "veteran" shall mean a resi-19 20 dent of the state who (i) is the primary named utility service accountholder; (ii) has had a total household income of less than fifty thou-21 sand dollars for the most recent two consecutive income tax years 23 beginning in two thousand nineteen, as verified by the department of 24 taxation and finance; and (iii) served in and who received any honorable

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 or general discharge from the United States army, navy, air force, marine corps, coast guard and/or the reserves thereof, and/or the army national guard, air national guard, New York guard or New York naval militia.

- (b) A primary named utility service accountholder shall provide the gas corporation, electric corporation or municipality an authenticated copy of his or her discharge papers to be eligible for such discount to demonstrate eligibility under paragraph (a) of this subdivision.
- 10 § 2. The public service law is amended by adding a new section 89-q to 11 read as follows:
  - § 89-q. Water discount program. 1. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the commission is authorized and directed to require waterworks corporations and municipal water systems to establish a discount program for veterans no later than ninety days after the effective date of this section. Such program shall offer a yearly benefit to veterans in the form of a ten percent discount on water utility bills. The fiscal impact of such program shall not be borne by customers and shall not be added to bills rendered by a waterworks corporation or municipal water system to customers.
  - (b) A waterworks corporation or municipal water system which offers such discount program shall conspicuously advertise the availability and amount of such discount on the website of such waterworks corporation or municipal water system. The availability and amount of such discount shall also be conspicuously advertised on the accessibility page of the website of such waterworks corporation or municipal water system.
  - 2. (a) For the purposes of this section, "veteran" shall mean a resident of the state who (i) is the primary named waterworks or municipal water system service accountholder; (ii) has had a total household income of less than fifty thousand dollars for the most recent two consecutive income tax years beginning in two thousand nineteen, as verified by the department of taxation and finance; and (iii) served in and who received any honorable or general discharge from the United States army, navy, air force, marine corps, coast guard and/or the reserves thereof, and/or the army national guard, air national guard, New York guard or New York naval militia.
  - (b) A primary named waterworks or municipal water system service accountholder shall provide the waterworks corporation or municipal water system an authenticated copy of his or her discharge papers to be eligible for such discount to demonstrate eligibility under paragraph (a) of this subdivision.
  - § 3. The public service law is amended by adding a new section 91-b to read as follows:
  - § 91-b. Telephone discount program. 1. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the commission is authorized and directed to require a telephone corporation to establish a discount program for veterans no later than ninety days after the effective date of this section. Such program shall offer a yearly benefit to veterans in the form of a ten percent discount on telephone bills. The fiscal impact of such program shall not be borne by customers and shall not be added to bills rendered by a telephone corporation to customers.
- 52 (b) A telephone corporation which offers such discount program shall
  53 conspicuously advertise the availability and amount of such discount on
  54 the website of such telephone corporation. The availability and amount
  55 of such discount shall also be conspicuously advertised on the accessi56 bility page of the website of such telephone corporation.

- (c) Participation in the federal government's Lifeline or Affordable Connectivity program, or any successor program the commission shall deem sufficient, shall satisfy the telephone corporation's or cable television company's obligation to establish a discount program under paragraph (a) of this subdivision, unless the commission deems it insufficient to satisfy such requirements.
- (d) Before applying a discount under paragraph (a) of this subdivision, a telephone corporation may require proof of eligibility from the primary named telephone service accountholder for the calendar year in which the discount is sought.
- 2. (a) For the purposes of this section, "veteran" shall mean a resident of the state who (i) is the primary named telephone service accountholder; (ii) has had a total household income of less than fifty thousand dollars for the most recent two consecutive income tax years beginning in two thousand nineteen, as verified by the department of taxation and finance; and (iii) served in and who received any honorable or general discharge from the United States army, navy, air force, marine corps, coast guard and/or the reserves thereof, and/or the army national guard, air national guard, New York guard or New York naval militia.
- (b) A primary named telephone service accountholder shall provide the telephone corporation an authenticated copy of his or her discharge papers to be eligible for such discount to demonstrate eligibility under paragraph (a) of this subdivision.
- § 4. The public service law is amended by adding a new section 224-d to read as follows:
- § 224-d. Cable discount program. 1. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the commission is authorized and directed to require a telephone corporation, as defined in subdivision seventeen of section two of this chapter, and a cable television company, as defined in section two hundred twelve of this article, that provides cable service to customers in New York, to establish a discount program for veterans no later than ninety days after the effective date of this section. Such program shall offer a yearly benefit to veterans in the form of a ten percent discount on cable bills. The fiscal impact of such program shall not be borne by customers and shall not be added to bills rendered by a telephone corporation or cable television company to customers.
- (b) A telephone corporation or cable television company which offers such discount program shall conspicuously advertise the availability and amount of such discount on the website of such telephone corporation or cable television company. The availability and amount of such discount shall also be conspicuously advertised on the accessibility page of the website of such telephone corporation or cable television company.
- (c) Participation in the federal government's Lifeline or Affordable Connectivity program, or any successor program the commission shall deem sufficient, shall satisfy the telephone corporation's or cable television company's obligation to establish a discount program under paragraph (a) of this subdivision, unless the commission deems it insufficient to satisfy such requirements.
- 50 (d) Before applying a discount under paragraph (a) of this subdivi-51 sion, a telephone corporation or cable television company may require 52 proof of eligibility from the primary named cable service accountholder 53 for the calendar year in which the discount is sought.
- 2. (a) For the purposes of this section, "veteran" shall mean a resident of the state who (i) is the primary named cable service accountholder; (ii) has had a total household income of less than fifty thou-

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sand dollars for the most recent two consecutive income tax years
beginning in two thousand nineteen, as verified by the department of
taxation and finance; and (iii) received any honorable or general
discharge from the United States army, navy, air force, marine corps,
coast guard and/or the reserves thereof, and/or the army national guard,
air national guard, New York guard or New York naval militia.

(b) A primary named cable service accountholder shall provide the telephone corporation or the cable television company an authenticated copy of his or her discharge papers to be eligible for such discount to demonstrate eligibility under paragraph (a) of this subdivision.

§ 5. This act shall take effect immediately.
