- Introduced by COMMITTEE ON RULES -- (at request of M. of A. Mitaynes) -- read once and referred to the Committee on Governmental Operations
- AN ACT to amend the executive law, the transportation law, the vehicle and traffic law, the town law, the county law, the general construction law and the personal property law, in relation to changing the designation of the public holiday of Columbus day to Indigenous People's day

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. The legislature hereby declares that beginning the second
Monday in October 2021, the holiday formerly known as Columbus day will
be designated as Indigenous People's day.

4 § 2. Subdivision 2 of section 403 of the executive law, as amended by 5 chapter 666 of the laws of 2004, is amended to read as follows:

2. The flag shall be displayed daily, weather permitting, on or near б 7 the main administration building of every public institution, whenever 8 such institution is open to the public. The flag shall also be 9 displayed, weather permitting, on the following days in each year: the first day of January, known as New Year's day; the third Monday of Janu-10 11 ary, known as Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. day; the twelfth day of Febru-12 ary, known as Lincoln's birthday; the third Monday in February, known as 13 Washington's birthday; the last Monday in May, known as Memorial day; 14 the second Sunday of June, known as Flag day; the fourth day of July, known as Independence day; the first Monday in September, known as Labor 15 day; the third Friday in September, known as National POW/MIA Recogni-16 tion day, except if such date of commemoration cannot be observed due to 17 a religious holiday, such observances shall then be conducted on the 18 second Friday in September; September eleventh, known as September 11th 19 20 Remembrance Day; the second Monday in October, known as [Columbus] 21 Indigenous People's day; the eleventh day of November, known as Veterans day; the fourth Thursday in November, known as Thanksgiving day; the 22 23 seventh day of December, known as Pearl Harbor day; and the twenty-fifth 24 day of December, known as Christmas day, and if any of such days except Flag day is Sunday, the next day thereafter; each general election day, 25

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and each day appointed by the President of the United States or by the 1 Governor of this state as a day of general thanksgiving or for display-2 3 ing the flag. Subparagraph (i) of paragraph (e) of subdivision 4 of section 4 § 3. 5 14-f of the transportation law, as amended by chapter 173 of the laws of 6 1990, is amended to read as follows: 7 (i) Any complaint issued for an equipment violation, except for a 8 violation involving an out-of-service defect or except for a violation involving the operation of any motor vehicle after it has been placed 9 10 out of service, shall be dismissed by the court before such summons is 11 returnable if the violation as set forth in the summons is corrected not 12 later than one-half hour after sunset on the first full business day after the issuance of the summons and proof of such correction as set 13 14 forth in subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph is submitted to the court. 15 the purposes of this subparagraph, "business day" shall mean any For calendar day except Sunday, or the following business holidays: New 16 17 Year's Day, Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor 18 Day, [Columbus] Indigenous People's Day, Veterans' Day, Thanksgiving Day 19 and Christmas Day. 20 § 4. Any complaint issued for any violation of section three hundred 47 seventy-five, three hundred seventy-six or three hundred eighty-one of this article relative to required equipment, except a 48 violation described in subdivision two of this section, subdivision forty-seven of 49 section three hundred seventy-five of this article, and except for a 50 violation relating to service brakes, shall be dismissed by the court 51 before which the summons is returnable if the violation as set forth in 52 the summons is corrected not later than one-half hour after sunset on 53 the first full business day after the issuance of the summons and proof 54 of such correction as set forth in subdivision five of this section is 55 56 submitted to the court. For the purposes of this subdivision, "business

Subdivision 12 of section 64 of the town law, as amended by chapб ter 658 of the laws of 2004, is amended to read as follows: 7 12. Appropriations for Independence day, Memorial day, [Columbus] Indigenous People's day and Veterans day. Any town may appropriate annu-8 9 ally such sums as it may deem appropriate for the purpose of defraying 10 the expenses of the proper observance of Independence day, Memorial or 11 Decoration day, [Columbus] Indigenous People's day and Veterans day in 12 such proportion as it may determine. Any town of the first class, or, any town having a population of five thousand inhabitants or more, 13 14 excepting any such town having a population of two hundred twenty-five 15 thousand inhabitants or more, according to the latest federal census, in 16 which one or more posts, camps or chapters of the Grand Army of the 17 Republic, the United Spanish War Veterans, the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the Jewish War Veterans of the United States, Inc., the Catholic War 18 Veterans, Inc., the Italian American War Veterans of the United States, 19 20 Incorporated, the Polish Legion of American Veterans, Inc., the Marine 21 Corps League, the Military Order of the Purple Heart, Inc., the American 22 Legion, the Disabled American Veterans, AMVETS, American Veterans of World War II, Masonic War Veterans of the State of New York, Inc., 23 Veterans of World War I of the United States of America Department of 24 25 New York, Inc., China-Burma-India Veterans Association, Inc., Polish-Am-26 erican Veterans of World War II, Amsterdam, N. Y., Inc., the Sons of Union Veterans, Vietnam Veterans of America, World War Veterans Club of 28 Lindenhurst, Inc. or the Eastern Paralyzed Veterans Association exists, 29 30 may appropriate annually an amount not to exceed five thousand dollars 31 for such purpose, and any town having a population of two hundred twen-32 ty-five thousand inhabitants or more, according to the latest federal 33 census, in which one or more such posts, camps or chapters exists may 34 annually appropriate an amount not to exceed five thousand dollars for 35 such purpose, and any town which has a population of five hundred thou-36 sand inhabitants or more, according to the latest federal census, in 37 which one or more such posts, camps or chapters exists may annually 38 appropriate an amount not to exceed ten thousand dollars for such 39 purpose. Any moneys appropriated pursuant to the provisions of this 40 subdivision shall be a general town charge, except that in any town having a population of two hundred twenty-five thousand inhabitants or 41 42 more there shall be a charge on that portion of the town outside of any 43 village therein and shall be assessed, levied and collected from real 44 property outside of any such village. Such sum when collected shall be 45 paid to the supervisor of such town and be disbursed by him in such 46 manner as the town board of such town may direct upon vouchers properly 47 receipted and audited by the town board of such town; except that in any 48 town in which there may be a post, camp or chapter of the Grand Army of the Republic, the United Spanish War Veterans, the Veterans of Foreign 49 Wars, the Jewish War Veterans of the United States, Inc., the Catholic 50 51 War Veterans, Inc., the Italian American War Veterans of the United 52 States, Incorporated, the Polish Legion of American Veterans, Inc., the 53 Marine Corps League, the Military Order of the Purple Heart, Inc., the 54 American Legion, the Disabled American Veterans, AMVETS, American Veter-55 ans of World War II, Masonic War Veterans of the State of New York, 56 Inc., Veterans of World War I of the United States of America Department

of New York, Inc., China-Burma-India Veterans Association, 1 Inc., Polish-American Veterans of World War II, Amsterdam, N. Y., Inc., 2 Polish-American Veterans of World War II, Schenectady, N. Y., Inc., the 3 Sons of Union Veterans, Vietnam Veterans of America, World War Veterans 4 5 Club of Lindenhurst, Inc. or the Eastern Paralyzed Veterans Association, 6 in any such town, the commanders and quartermasters of such posts, camp 7 or chapter may direct the manner and extent of such observance and the 8 supervisor shall pay the expenses thereof upon the order or orders of 9 the commander or quartermaster of such post, camp or chapter, which 10 orders shall be his vouchers for such payment, and in case there may be 11 or more posts, camps or chapters of the Grand Army of the Republic, two 12 the United Spanish War Veterans, the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the Jewish War Veterans of the United States, Inc., the Catholic War Veter-13 14 ans, Inc., the Italian American War Veterans of the United States, 15 Incorporated, the Polish Legion of American Veterans, Inc., the Marine 16 Corps League, the Military Order of the Purple Heart, Inc., the American 17 Legion, the Disabled American Veterans, AMVETS, American Veterans of 18 World War II, Masonic War Veterans of the State of New York, Inc., Veterans of World War I of the United States of America Department of 19 20 New York, Inc., China-Burma-India Veterans Association, Inc., Polish-Am-21 erican Veterans of World War II, Amsterdam, N. Y., Inc., the Sons of Union Veterans of 23 Veterans, Vietnam Veterans of America, World War Veterans Club of 24 Lindenhurst, Inc. or the Eastern Paralyzed Veterans Association, in any 25 such town, the commanders and quartermasters of such posts, camps or 26 chapters by concurrent action, shall direct the supervisor of such town 27 what proportion of such moneys so raised shall be expended by each of 28 such posts, camps or chapters which proportion shall be paid by such 29 supervisor upon the order or orders of the commander and quartermaster 30 of each of such posts. In case there is a post, camp or chapter in a town adjoining a town in which no post, camp or chapter is located, 31 32 whose membership includes at least three residents of such town having 33 no post, camp or chapter, the post, camp or chapter shall appoint a committee of not less than three of its members who are residents of the 34 35 said adjoining town in which the post, camp or chapter is not located, 36 and the supervisor of said town shall pay the expenses of observance of 37 Independence day, Memorial or Decoration day and Veterans day upon the 38 order or orders of said committee or a majority thereof, which orders 39 shall be his vouchers for such payment.

40 § 7. Section 226-a of the county law, as added by chapter 80 of the 41 laws of 1969, is amended to read as follows:

§ 226-a. Patriotic observances. The county legislature and/or board of supervisors, as the case may be, of any county or borough outside the city of New York, is hereby authorized to appropriate and set aside each year such sums it may deem proper for the purpose of providing for the due and proper observance of any legal holiday, including [Columbus] 17 Indigenous People's day.

48 § 8. Section 24 of the general construction law, as amended by chapter 49 249 of the laws of 2020, is amended to read as follows:

50 § 24. Public holidays; half-holidays. The term public holiday includes 51 the following days in each year: the first day of January, known as New 52 Year's day; the third Monday of January, known as Dr. Martin Luther 53 King, Jr. day; the twelfth day of February, known as Lincoln's birthday; 54 the third Monday in February, known as Washington's birthday; the last 55 Monday in May, known as Memorial day; the second Sunday in June, known 56 as Flag day; the nineteenth day of June, known as Juneteenth; the fourth

day of July, known as Independence day; the first Monday in September, 1 2 known as Labor day; the second Monday in October, known as [Columbus] Indigenous People's day; the eleventh day of November, known as Veter-3 ans' day; the fourth Thursday in November, known as Thanksgiving day; 4 5 and the twenty-fifth day of December, known as Christmas day, and if any б of such days except Flag day is Sunday, the next day thereafter; each 7 general election day, and each day appointed by the president of the 8 United States or by the governor of this state as a day of general 9 thanksgiving, general fasting and prayer, or other general religious 10 observances. The term half-holiday includes the period from noon to 11 midnight of each Saturday which is not a public holiday.

12 § 9. Subdivision 6 of section 426 of the personal property law, as 13 added by chapter 659 of the laws of 1976, is amended to read as follows: 14 6. "Business day" shall mean any calendar day except Sunday, or the 15 following business holidays: New Year's Day, Washington's Birthday, 16 Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, [Columbus] Indigenous 17 People's Day, Veterans' Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day.

18 § 10. Subdivision 7 of section 441 of the personal property law, as added by chapter 326 of the laws of 1995, is amended to read as follows: 7. "Business day" shall mean any calendar day except Sunday, or the following business holidays: New Year's Day, Martin Luther King Day, Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, [Columbus] Indigenous People's Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day.

25 § 11. This act shall take effect immediately.
