AN ACT to amend the canal law, in relation to the general powers and duties of the canal corporation

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subdivision 14 of section 10 of the canal law, as amended 1 2 by chapter 420 of the laws of 1968, is amended and two new subdivisions 3 6-a and 8-a are added to read as follows: 4 6-a. Cause the locks and lift bridges of the canal system to be oper-5 ated annually for the passage of commercial and recreational traffic б between May first and November fifteenth, generally, subject to natural 7 conditions, weather, required maintenance, capital rehabilitation work, 8 or other factors related to safe canal operation. 8-a. Maintain and preserve the integrity of the Erie Canal's historic 9 10 resources, including its structures, floating plant, and unique landside 11 features. 12 14. Permit <u>commercial</u> boat [owners] <u>companies</u> operating upon the canal 13 system to use state drydocks, travel lifts, or other facilities for 14 required coast quard drydock inspections, for non-navigation season 15 storage, or while making emergency repairs to their vessels at rates 16 prescribed under subchapter D of chapter III of title twenty-one of the New York state codes, rules and regulations. 17 18 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately
