Introduced by M. of A. BRONSON -- read once and referred to the Committee on Economic Development

AN ACT to amend the general business law, in relation to fire suppression systems and licensing professionals to perform authorized work on fire suppression systems

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Legislative intent. (a) The legislature hereby finds that:

2 (1) The manner in which fire suppression or sprinkler systems are
3 constructed, installed, maintained and inspected have a direct and
4 substantial impact on public safety.

5 (2) Improper construction, installation, maintenance or inspection of
6 fire suppression systems by persons lacking adequate education, training
7 and experience can lead to serious injuries, death and substantial prop-
8 erty damage.

9 (3) Promulgating a code establishing minimum qualification standards
10 for work performed on fire suppressions systems, including criteria for
11 the education, training, testing and licensing of persons performing
12 such work will promote public safety.

13 (b) It is the intent of the legislature and this act:

14 (1) To ensure that work on fire suppression systems is performed by
15 persons who have sufficient education, training and experience in such
16 work.

17 (2) To ensure that adequate qualification standards are maintained
18 through adherence of proper education, training, testing and licensing
19 requirements for those engaged in the sprinkler fitting trades.

20 (3) To establish a state board of examiners for the sprinkler fitting
21 industry to ensure proper qualification and examination of persons
22 performing work on fire suppression systems and to ensure proper adher-
23 ence to and enforcement of the requirements of this act and applicable
24 regulations issued pursuant to this act.

25 § 2. The general business law is amended by adding a new article 40-A
26 to read as follows:

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ARTICLE 40-A
FIRE SUPPRESSION SYSTEMS

§ 930. Definitions. As used in this article, unless the context requires otherwise:

(a) "Fire suppression system" means an automatic or manual system designed to protect occupants and/or buildings or structures from fire. Such systems include, but are not limited to, water sprinkler, water spray, foam-water, foam-water spray, carbon dioxide, foam extinguishing, dry chemical, wet chemical, halogenated and other chemical systems used for fire protection. Such systems also include the supply mains, yard hydrants, standpipes, tank heaters, hose connections to sprinkler systems, air lines and thermal systems used in connection with sprinklers and pumps dedicated for fire suppression.

(b) "Fire suppression system inspector" means a person licensed under this article to perform inspections on fire suppression systems.

(c) "Fire suppression system inspector license" means a license issued to a fire suppression system inspector pursuant to this article authorizing the person to perform inspections on fire suppression systems.

(d) "Sprinkler fitter" means a person, other than an apprentice or helper regulated under this article, who performs work on a fire suppression system as defined by this section.

(e) "Sprinkler fitter apprentice" means a person who is enrolled in a sprinkler fitter apprenticeship program and is learning and working on fire suppression systems under the supervision of another person certified in accordance with the provisions of this article.

(f) "Sprinkler fitter apprentice permit" means a permit issued to an apprentice sprinkler fitter pursuant to this article authorizing the person to perform work on fire suppression systems.

(g) "Sprinkler fitter apprenticeship program" means an apprenticeship training program that is approved by the U.S. department of labor, bureau of apprenticeship and training or a state apprenticeship agency and consists of a minimum of ten thousand hours of documented practical experience in work on fire suppression systems, combined with a minimum of seven hundred twenty hours of related instruction, including classroom or shop instruction, in the sprinkler fitter trade.

(h) "Sprinkler fitter helper" means a person who works on fire suppression systems under the direct supervision of a licensed sprinkler fitter.

(i) "Sprinkler fitter helper permit" means a permit issued to a sprinkler fitter helper pursuant to this article authorizing the person to

1 perform work on fire suppression systems under the direct supervision of
2 a licensed sprinkler fitter.

3 (j) "Sprinkler fitter license" means a license issued to a sprinkler
4 fitter pursuant to this article authorizing the person to perform work
5 on fire suppression systems.

6 (k) "State board of examiners for the sprinkler fitting industry" or
7 "board" means the board of examiners created pursuant to this article.

8 (l) "Work on a fire suppression system" means the construction,
9 installation, alteration, renovation, removal, repair, servicing, main-
10 tenance or testing of fire suppression systems, unless specifically
11 excluded by the provisions of this article.

12 § 931. Authorized work on fire suppression systems. (a) No person
13 within the jurisdiction of this state may perform work on a fire
14 suppression system unless he or she:

15 (1) Possesses a sprinkler fitter license, sprinkler fitter apprentice
16 or helper permit or fire suppression system inspector license issued
17 pursuant to this article;

18 (2) Performs work on portable fire extinguishers or work on dry stand-
19 pipes that are not connected to a fire suppression system; or

20 (3) Is employed as a state or local fire official.

21 (b) No person may employ a person or cause or direct a person to
22 perform work on a fire suppression system unless the person performing
23 such work possesses a sprinkler fitter license, sprinkler fitter appren-
24 tice or helper permit or fire suppression system inspector license
25 issued pursuant to this article.

26 (c) No person, corporation, partnership or other business entity may
27 perform or contract to perform work on fire suppression systems except
28 through persons who possess a sprinkler fitter license, sprinkler fitter
29 apprentice or helper permit or fire suppression system inspector license
30 issued pursuant to this article.

31 (d) The requirements of this article do not apply to work on fire
32 suppression systems in New York city, Nassau county or Suffolk county.

33 (e) Nothing in this article shall prevent any political subdivision of
34 the state from enacting local legislation that establishes qualification
35 standards for the sprinkler fitter trade that exceed the requirements of
36 this article.

37 § 932. State board of examiners for the sprinkler fitting industry.
38 (a) There is hereby established in the safety and health license and
39 certification unit of the department of labor a state board of examiners
40 for the sprinkler fitting industry.

41 (b) Composition. The board shall consist of seven members appointed by
42 the governor, with advice and consent of the senate, as follows:

43 (1) one representative from the division of homeland security and
44 emergency services, office of fire prevention and control;

45 (2) one representative from the department of state, division of
46 building standards and codes;

47 (3) one fire suppression contractor;

48 (4) one licensed fire protection engineer;

49 (5) one sprinkler fitter licensed in accordance with this article;

50 (6) one representative from the New York state pipe trades associ-
51 ation; and

52 (7) one representative from the New York state apprenticeship and
53 training council.

54 § 933. Powers and duties of the state board of examiners for the
55 sprinkler fitting industry. In addition to all other powers and duties

1 conferred or imposed upon the board, the board is authorized and
2 empowered to:

3 (a) elect its own officers and prescribe their duties;

4 (b) grant sprinkler fitter licenses and permits to duly qualified
5 applicants as provided in this article;

6 (c) establish fees that are reasonable and necessary to defray the
7 cost of administering this article;

8 (d) promulgate, adopt, amend, and repeal such rules and regulations,
9 not inconsistent with the laws of this state, as may be necessary for
10 the orderly conduct of its affairs and the administration of this arti-
11 cle;

12 (e) enforce the provisions of this article and any codes, rules or
13 regulations hereunder through inspections, audits, citations, civil
14 penalties, and any other appropriate means;

15 (f) subpoena records and documents, conduct hearings and compel the
16 attendance of witnesses pursuant to an investigation or a hearing of the
17 board;

18 (g) bring a suit, in any court of competent jurisdiction, to cause the
19 enjoinder of all persons violating this article. When seeking an injunc-
20 tion, the board shall not be required to prove that an adequate remedy
21 at law does not exist or that substantial or irreparable damages would
22 result if an injunction is not granted;

23 (h) establish and administer or contract out to a recognized third-
24 party certifier for examinations as required for licenses under this
25 article and determine satisfactory performance for these examinations;

26 (i) revoke or suspend a license or permit issued under this article,
27 or reprimand persons for incompetence or any violations of this article
28 or rules or regulations of the board; and

29 (j) establish a procedure for reinstating licenses or permits that
30 have been revoked or suspended, including the use of retesting proce-
31 dures.

32 § 934. Sprinkler fitter license. (a) To obtain a sprinkler fitter
33 license under this article, an applicant must:

34 (1) pay an application fee established by the board; and

35 (2) provide evidence demonstrating that he or she has successfully
36 completed a sprinkler fitter apprenticeship program and has passed a
37 sprinkler fitter license examination established by the board; or

38 (3) meet the requirements of section nine hundred thirty-seven or nine
39 hundred thirty-eight of this article.

40 (b) All persons holding a sprinkler fitter license under this article
41 shall complete a minimum of eight hours annually of education and skill
42 training on fire suppression systems, provided:

43 (1) courses for such training shall be pre-approved by the board and
44 evidence of completion of continuing education requirements shall be
45 submitted to the board with the application for license renewal; and

46 (2) the continuing education requirement does not apply until the
47 conclusion of the first full year after initial issuance of a person's
48 sprinkler fitter license.

49 (c) A sprinkler fitter license under this article shall be valid for a
50 period of three years from date of issue.

51 (d) The board shall renew for a period of three years licenses or
52 permits as provided by this article upon receiving a completed renewal
53 application and required fee as determined by the board.

54 (e) Any person who is issued a sprinkler fitter license shall be
55 issued a photo identification card and shall maintain such card in his

1 or her possession at all times when performing work on fire suppression
2 systems.

3 § 935. Sprinkler fitter apprentice and helper permits. (a) To obtain a
4 sprinkler fitter apprentice permit, an applicant must:

5 (1) pay an application fee established by the board;
6 (2) complete an application for an apprentice permit established by
7 the board; and

8 (3) present evidence in a form acceptable to the board, demonstrating
9 that the applicant is enrolled in a sprinkler fitter apprenticeship
10 program.

11 (b) The sprinkler fitter apprentice permit shall state that it is
12 valid only if the person to whom it is issued remains enrolled in a
13 sprinkler fitter apprenticeship program. This permit shall be valid for
14 a period of three years from the date of issuance and may be renewed
15 once upon submission of a renewal application and a renewal fee deter-
16 mined by the board.

17 (c) To obtain a sprinkler fitter helper permit, an applicant must:

18 (1) pay an application fee established by the board;
19 (2) complete an application for a helper permit by the board; and
20 (3) present evidence in a form acceptable to the board demonstrating
21 that the applicant is employed as a sprinkler fitter helper that shall
22 include specific acknowledgement from the applicant and his or her
23 employer that the applicant is only authorized to work under the direct
24 supervision of a licensed sprinkler fitter.

25 (d) A sprinkler fitter helper permit shall state that the person
26 possessing it may only perform work on fire suppression systems under
27 the direct supervision of a licensed sprinkler fitter on a one-on-one
28 basis. This permit shall be valid for a period of eighteen months from
29 the date of issuance and shall not be eligible for renewal.

30 (e) Any person who is issued a sprinkler fitter apprentice or helper
31 permit shall be issued a photo identification card and shall maintain
32 such card in his or her possession at all times when performing work on
33 fire suppression systems.

34 § 936. Fire suppression system inspector. (a) To obtain a fire
35 suppression system inspector license, an applicant must:

36 (1) pay an application fee established by the board;
37 (2) complete an application for a fire suppression system inspector
38 license established by the board that provides evidence in a form
39 acceptable to the board of one of the following:

40 (A) at least two thousand hours of experience in the inspection of
41 fire suppression systems;

42 (B) completion of a sprinkler fitter apprenticeship program; or

43 (C) possession of a level one certificate from the national institute
44 for certification for engineering technologies for inspection and test-
45 ing for water based fire protection systems; and

46 (3) complete an examination established by the board for a fire
47 suppression system inspector.

48 (b) The board shall renew for a period of three years a fire
49 suppression system inspector license upon receiving a completed renewal
50 application and required fee as determined by the board.

51 (c) Any person who is issued a fire suppression system inspector
52 license shall be issued a photo identification card and shall maintain
53 such card in his or her possession at all times when performing
54 inspections on fire suppression systems.

55 § 937. Reciprocity. (a) The board may issue a reciprocity sprinkler
56 fitter license or fire suppression system inspector license, without

1 examination to any currently practicing, competent sprinkler fitter or
2 fire suppression system inspector who holds a similar authorization
3 granted by any other state according to the laws of such state which has
4 qualification requirements substantially similar to, or greater than,
5 those established under this article; provided that the other state
6 grants authorization to any competent person holding a license under
7 this article.

8 (b) The board may issue a sprinkler fitter license or fire suppression
9 system inspector license pursuant to this section to any person who:

10 (1) Completes an application for sprinkler fitter license or fire
11 suppression system inspector license by reciprocity established by the
12 board;

13 (2) Presents competent evidence in a form acceptable to the board
14 demonstrating that the applicant is a currently practicing, competent
15 person who holds a similar authorization granted by any other state
16 according to the laws of such state which has qualification requirements
17 substantially similar to, or greater than, those established under this
18 article; and

19 (3) Pays the appropriate fees established by the board.

20 § 938. Transitional grace period. (a) There shall be a one-year peri-
21 od from the effective date of this article that shall serve as a grace
22 period for all persons applying for sprinkler fitter licenses and fire
23 suppression inspector licenses.

24 (b) During the one-year grace period no person shall be required to
25 possess a sprinkler fitter license, apprentice or helper permit or fire
26 suppression system inspector license, provided he or she has submitted
27 the necessary application for such credentials within one hundred eighty
28 days from the effective date of this article.

29 (c) The board shall issue a sprinkler fitter license without examina-
30 tion to any person who submits an application for a sprinkler fitter
31 license during the one hundred eighty day period after the effective
32 date of this article, provided the applicant pays the required applica-
33 tion fee and submits evidence demonstrating he or she has:

34 (1) completed a sprinkler fitter apprenticeship program; or

35 (2) performed at least ten thousand hours of documented practical
36 experience of work on fire suppression systems within the past eight
37 years.

38 (d) The board shall issue a fire suppression inspector license without
39 examination to any person who submits an application for a fire
40 suppression inspector license during the one hundred eighty day period
41 after the effective date of this article, provided the applicant pays
42 the required application fee and submits evidence demonstrating he or
43 she has:

44 (1) At least two thousand hours of experience in the inspection of
45 fire suppression systems;

46 (2) Completion of a sprinkler fitter apprenticeship program; or

47 (3) Possession of a level one certificate from the national institute
48 for certification for engineering technologies for inspection and test-
49 ing for water based fire protection systems.

50 (e) Initial applications for sprinkler fitter apprentice or helper
51 permits shall be submitted by applicants within one hundred eighty days
52 from the effective date of this article in accordance with the require-
53 ments of section nine hundred thirty-five of this article.

54 § 939. Registry of sprinkler fitter licenses and permits. (a) The
55 board shall establish a fire suppression system technician registry to
56 maintain a central registry of the names of all persons to whom it has

1 issued fire suppression system inspector licenses, sprinkler fitter
2 licenses and sprinkler fitter permits.

3 (b) The fire suppression system technician registry shall be main-
4 tained on a publicly accessible website and shall be updated on a month-
5 ly basis.

6 § 940. Violations. It shall be unlawful and a violation of this arti-
7 cle for any person to:

8 (a) perform work on a fire suppression system without possessing an
9 applicable license or permit as required by this article;

10 (b) employ a person or cause or direct a person to perform work on a
11 fire suppression system unless the person performing such work holds an
12 applicable license or permit as required by this article;

13 (c) engage in other conduct prohibited by section nine hundred thir-
14 ty-three of this article;

15 (d) obtain a license or permit required by this article through error,
16 fraud or intentional or reckless misrepresentation;

17 (e) impersonate another person, use an expired or revoked license or
18 permit issued pursuant to this article or allow another person to use a
19 license or permit not issued to such person;

20 (f) give false or forged evidence of any kind to the board or any
21 member thereof in an application for the issuance or renewal of a
22 license or permit under this article; or

23 (g) knowingly or recklessly make a material false statement regarding
24 a person's license, or permit or status with intent to influence,
25 persuade, or induce an individual to contract for services regulated
26 under this article.

27 § 941. Penalties. (a) The board shall revoke or suspend a license or
28 permit issued under this article, or reprimand a license or permit hold-
29 er for incompetence or any violation of this article or rules or regu-
30 lations of the board issued pursuant to this article.

31 (b) Any person who violates any provision of this article or any
32 applicable rule, regulation, permit or other order of the board shall be
33 subject to a civil penalty of not less than five hundred dollars and not
34 more than one thousand dollars for each act or violation. Each day a
35 person performs work on a fire suppression system without a required
36 license or permit as required by this article shall constitute a sepa-
37 rate violation.

38 (c) A person who willfully violates this article or any applicable
39 rule or regulation adopted pursuant to this article shall be guilty of a
40 misdemeanor.

41 (d) In addition to any other penalties provided in this section, a
42 person, corporation or other business entity that knowingly employs or
43 directs a person to perform work on a fire suppression system in
44 violation of this article shall forfeit any business or contractor
45 license, registration or certificate issued by the state for a period of
46 not less than one year and not more than three years, as determined by
47 the state attorney general. For purposes of this section, the term
48 "knowingly" shall mean actions that are willful or taken with deliberate
49 ignorance or reckless disregard of the requirements of this article.

50 § 942. Enforcement. (a) The requirements of this article will be
51 enforced by the board in conjunction with the licensure and certif-
52 ication unit within the department of labor.

53 (b) The licensure and certification unit within the department of
54 labor shall inspect project work sites where work on fire suppression
55 systems is being performed to ensure that persons performing such work
56 possess applicable licenses and permits required by this article.

1 (c) In any circumstances where the licensure and certification unit
2 within the department of labor determines that work on fire suppression
3 systems is being performed in violation of this article, it shall issue
4 or cause to be issued a stop work order requiring that all such work
5 cease and require that such work shall not be resumed until a full
6 investigation has been undertaken and verification has been made that
7 all work on the fire suppression system in question has been performed
8 by duly authorized persons.

9 § 943. Severability. To the extent that any section or portion of this
10 article is deemed invalid by a reviewing court, the remainder of this
11 article shall be unaffected by such ruling.

12 § 3. This act shall take effect on the one hundred eightieth day after
13 it shall have become a law. Effective immediately, the addition, amend-
14 ment and/or repeal of any rule or regulation necessary for the implemen-
15 tation of this act on its effective date are authorized to be made and
16 completed on or before such effective date.
