AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to establishing the bilingual teachers of tomorrow teacher recruitment and retention program

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. The education law is amended by adding a new section 3615 1 2 to read as follows: § 3615. Bilingual teachers of tomorrow teacher recruitment and 3 4 retention program. 1. Definitions. a. The term "bilingual teacher shortage area" means a public school or subject area in which there was a 5 6 shortage of bilingual, certified teachers in the previous school year 7 and there is a projected shortage in the current school year as deter-8 mined by the commissioner. b. The term "bilingual, certified teacher" means a teacher who holds a 9 10 permanent or professional state teaching certificate appropriate to the 11 teaching position, including the subject area if applicable, in which he 12 or she is to be employed and who is fully qualified to teach in a bilin-13 gual education program. c. The term "school district" shall mean a common, union free, 14 15 central, central high school, or city school district. 16 d. The term "board of education" shall mean the governing board of any 17 public school or public school district defined in paragraph c of this 18 <u>subdivision.</u> e. The term "low-performing, limited English proficiency school" shall 19 20 mean a school building which is under registration review or a school 21 building performing significantly below state standards as defined by 22 the commissioner and which has a substantial proportion of limited 23 English proficiency pupils, as determined by the commissioner. f. The term "year of service" shall mean ten months of continuous 24 25 full-time service as a teacher during a school year, generally occurring

26 between September first and June thirtieth.

EXPLANATION--Matter in <u>italics</u> (underscored) is new; matter in brackets [-] is old law to be omitted.

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2. Application and funding. a. Grants shall be made to school 1 districts for bilingual, certified teacher recruitment and retention 2 activities necessary to increase the supply of bilingual, certified 3 4 teachers in school districts experiencing a bilingual, certified teacher 5 shortage in accordance with subdivision three of this section and in 6 school districts containing a low-performing, limited English proficien-7 cy school. 8 b. Such grants shall be awarded to school districts, within the limits 9 of funds appropriated therefor, through a competitive process that takes 10 into consideration the magnitude of any shortage of bilingual, certified 11 teachers in the school district, the fiscal capacity and geographic 12 sparsity of the district, and the number of new bilingual, certified teachers the school district intends to hire in the coming school year. 13 14 Grants provided pursuant to this section shall be used only for the 15 purposes enumerated in this section. c. Not more than sixty percent of the funds allocated pursuant to this 16 17 section shall be made available to any one school district and provided further that a city school district in a city with populations in excess 18 19 of one million inhabitants may, notwithstanding any other provision of 20 this section, allocate a portion of the grant received pursuant to this 21 section for bilingual, certified teacher recruitment and outreach activ-22 ities provided that any allocation for bilingual, certified teacher recruitment and outreach activities shall not exceed two hundred twen-23 ty-five thousand dollars. 24 d. In allocating grants pursuant to this section, a school district 25 shall give priority in the following order: 26 27 (1) first, to a school under registration review that is designated as 28 a bilingual teacher shortage area; (2) second, to any low-performing, limited English proficiency school; 29 30 and 31 (3) third, to any school that is designated as a bilingual teacher 32 shortage area. 33 e. Any school district receiving funds under this section shall main-34 tain any local effort in the current year equivalent to such effort in the base year for any local program related to the recruitment or 35 36 retention of teachers or any program that has purposes that are similar 37 to any purpose of this section or the district shall provide a local match to state funds received pursuant to this section. State funds 38 39 provided pursuant to this section shall not supplant local funds for any 40 purpose similar to the purposes of this section. f. Applications by a school district for funding pursuant to this 41 42 section shall be filed with the commissioner, in a form determined by 43 the commissioner, by June first of the base year and school districts 44 shall be notified of their grant award by June thirtieth of the base 45 year, provided that in any year such application and award dates may be 46 modified by the commissioner for the reasonable administration of the 47 program. Such application shall include a plan by the school district for the expenditure of the funds in each category of allowable expenses 48 49 authorized by subdivision three of this section, and such expenditures 50 shall be consistent with such plan and the provisions of this section. 51 g. A person receiving an award pursuant to any subdivision of this 52 section shall not be eligible for an award pursuant to any other subdi-53 vision of this section in a school year. 54 3. Bilingual teachers of tomorrow teacher recruitment incentive 55 Bilingual teachers of tomorrow teacher recruitment incentive program. awards may be available to teachers pursuant to the provisions of this 56

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1	subdivision to attract teachers to employment in bilingual teacher shor-
2	tage areas.
3	a. Eligibility. To be eligible for an award pursuant to this subdivi-
4	sion, an applicant shall:
5	(1) be a bilingual, certified teacher;
б	(2) agree to a service obligation of one year of service in a bilin-
7	qual teacher shortage area as a condition of receiving an award pursuant
8	to this subdivision; and
9	(3) be employed for the first time as a bilingual, certified teacher
10	in the school district.
11	b. Application and selection. (1) The board of education shall deter-
12	mine the form of the application and the application process for teach-
13	ers deemed eligible for the award, and shall in its discretion select
$14^{13}$	the number of eligible applicants who will receive an award pursuant to
15	this subdivision.
16	(2) If the number of eliqible applicants exceeds the number of awards
17	determined by the board pursuant to this subdivision, then the board
18	shall use an objective competitive process based on educational quali-
$10 \\ 19$	fications to determine which eligible applicants shall receive awards.
20	<u>c. Payment of awards. (1) Annual awards from state and local funds</u>
	provided for this purpose shall be paid by the board of education to the
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22	award recipient. Award recipients shall be entitled to receive awards
23	pursuant to the provisions of this subdivision and such awards shall be
24	in addition to and not part of any award recipient's base salary.
25	(2) The initial annual award shall be ten thousand dollars, and such
26	initial award may be renewable each year, for up to three additional
27	years, provided that the recipient agrees to one year of service as a
28	full-time bilingual, certified teacher in a bilingual teacher shortage
29	area for each year of a renewed award and has provided satisfactory
30	service in any prior year in which an initial or renewed award was
31	granted to the recipient. No awards shall be made for less than one
32	school year of service and the sum of any initial and renewed awards
33	shall not exceed forty thousand dollars.
34	Awards made pursuant to this subdivision shall be used to reimburse
35	any educational costs, including those for which student loans may have
36	been taken, incurred by the recipient prior to receipt of the award for
37	certification as a teacher in the public schools of the state.
38	(3) The board of education shall develop and secure from the award
39	recipient a written agreement outlining the service obligation. Such
40	agreement shall include provisions for the recipient to repay the amount
41	of the award to the school district if the recipient fails to complete
42	his or her service obligation in any year where an initial or renewed
43	award is granted, and such repaid amounts shall be deducted from any
44	grant amounts due to the district from the state pursuant to this
45	section. Upon a written appeal by an award recipient, the board of
46	education, in its discretion, may provide a waiver of repayment
47	provisions for an award recipient who fails to complete his or her
48	service requirement for documented reasons of health or other severe
49	hardship, as determined by the commissioner.
50	d. Notification. The board of education shall notify both successful
51	and unsuccessful applicants by September first of any school year for
52	which an initial or renewed award is provided to teachers pursuant to
53	this subdivision.
54	4. Reporting. By November first following the completion of each
55	school year, the commissioner shall report to the governor and the
	legislature regarding the bilingual teachers of tomorrow teacher

1	recruitment and retention program. Such report shall list the amount of
2	each school district's total grant pursuant to this section, the uses of
3	the grant by each eligible category of expense, and the number of awards
4	granted by type pursuant to this section, as well as an analysis of the
5	effectiveness of the program in recruiting and retaining bilingual,
6	certified teachers in the public schools of the state designated as
7	bilingual teacher shortage areas

8 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
