WHEREAS, Asian-Americans across the State will wear red, light firecrackers and make other loud noises, in accord with ancient legend in which such activities were thought to chase away the wild beast Nian, who would attack ancient villages at the outset of the New Year; and

WHEREAS, Recognizing the significance of their contributions to the State of New York, this Legislative Body is proud to honor all New Yorkers of Asian ancestry, joining with them in welcoming the Year of the Tiger, on February 1, 2022; now, therefore, be it
