WHEREAS, Rick Jeanneret became the Buffalo Sabres' radio play-by-play announcer on October 10, 1971, and in 1995, he began calling the action for the team's televised games as well; and

WHEREAS, Known as the voice of the Buffalo Sabres, Rick Jeanneret's memorable calls and player nicknames have become forever linked with the club's history for generations of fans, from "May Day" to "La-La-La-La-La-La-La-Fontaine" to "Scary Good" to "Top Shelf, Where Momma Hides the Cookies"; and

WHEREAS, For his steadfast and unremitting commitment to his profession, Rick Jeanneret was the recipient of numerous awards and accolades including the prestigious 2012 Foster Hewitt Memorial Award; he was recognized by the Hockey Hall of Fame in November of 2012, and inducted into the Sabres Hall of Fame in 2011, and the Greater Buffalo Sports Hall of Fame in 2012; and

WHEREAS, On April 1, 2022, before the game against the Nashville Predators, a banner bearing Rick Jeanneret's name was raised to the KeyBank Center rafters alongside other Sabres legends before an enthusiastic, sold-out crowd which included his family, past and present broadcast partners, owners Terry and Kim Pegula, and more than 30 former Sabres players; and

WHEREAS, Throughout his career, spanning over five decades, Rick Jeanneret will always be remembered for his distinctive voice and for

his knowledge and passion for the game of hockey; and

WHEREAS, With him throughout have been his wife, Sandra, and their two sons, Mark and Chris, all of whom feel privileged to be a part of his life and rejoice in his achievements; and

WHEREAS, During his tenure with the Buffalo Sabres Hockey Team, Rick Jeanneret truly earned the admiration, esteem and affection of his colleagues; now, therefore, be it
