WHEREAS, The prestigious Purple Heart is awarded to members of the armed forces of the United States who are wounded by an instrument of war in the hands of the enemy and posthumously to the next of kin in the name of those who are killed in action or die of wounds received in action; and

WHEREAS, After 52 years of delays, Sergeant Robert B. Cierniak received this long overdue award for wounds he suffered when his helicopter was struck by enemy fire on March 31, 1970; and

WHEREAS, Robert B. Cierniak proudly served his country as a member of Company C, 5th Special Forces Group, 1st Special Forces in the United States Army during the Vietnam War; the Special Forces groups and Vietnamese irregular soldiers joined together to form the MIKE Force, a quick-reaction unit that was used to secure or reinforce or retake captured local base camps; and

WHEREAS, Having exhibited his patriotism both at home and abroad, Sergeant Robert B. Cierniak demonstrated his love for his country and merits forevermore, the highest respect of his State and Nation; and

WHEREAS, Our Nation's veterans deserve to be recognized, commended and thanked by the people of the State of New York for their service and for their dedication to their communities, their State and their Nation; now, therefore, be it
