WHEREAS, Gerald Klein's commitment to excellence, and his spirit of humanity, carried over into all fields of enterprise, including charitable and civic endeavors; and

WHEREAS, A long-time congregant at Temple Israel of Northern Westchester, Gerald Klein enjoyed being a Croton Lion and volunteering on many charitable committees; a board member of the Hudson Valley Gateway Chamber of Commerce, he also served as chairman of the Cortlandt Planning Board; and

WHEREAS, Gerald Klein is survived by his wife, Lee; and their three children; as well as many family members, friends, and coworkers; and

WHEREAS, Armed with a humanistic spirit and imbued with a sense of compassion, Gerald Klein leaves behind a legacy which will long endure the passage of time and will remain as a comforting memory to all he served and befriended; he truly merits the grateful tribute of this Legislative Body; now, therefore, be it
