WHEREAS, Bill Houck moved to Brant Lake, New York, and joined the Horicon Volunteer Fire Company in December of 1970, making his first call in 1971; throughout his five decades of service, he has responded to approximately 4,000 calls; and

WHEREAS, Always ready and willing to lend a helping hand and share his knowledge, Bill Houck mentored many young firefighters, teaching them about pumps, how to tie knots, about brush fires, and how to obey the speed limit; and

WHEREAS, Bill Houck also organized historical Company documents, served on the Horicon Fire Department Board of Directors for 25 years and used his masonry skills to help build the Adirondack Firehouse and many construction projects at the Brant Lake Firehouse; and

WHEREAS, In addition to his work with the Fire Company, Bill Houck served the Horicon and Hague community from 1970-1998 as a forest ranger; throughout his tenure, he responded to hundreds of Adirondack searches, rescues, and forest fires, and answered the call as part of a ranger team fighting fires in Idaho, California, Wisconsin and Montana; today, he is a member of the board of the Forest Ranger Scholarship Fund; and

WHEREAS, Bill Houck was also a certified teacher with the New York State trapper training program, teaching and mentoring many people as they earned their trapping and hunting licenses; and

WHEREAS, With him throughout have been his wife, Joyce; their two sons, Russell and Roger (Melanie); and three grandchildren, Hannah, Clara and Lydia; as well as Michael Sallach, who is like a son to him;

all of them truly feel privileged to be a part of his life and rejoice in his achievements; and

WHEREAS, Firefighters unwaveringly serve our great State with pride, valor, and integrity; these respected volunteers are often the first to respond to an emergency, whether the emergency is a fire, transportation accident, natural disaster, act of terrorism, medical crisis, or spill of hazardous materials; and
