AN ACT to amend the executive law, in relation to directing the state director of veterans' affairs to submit a plan relating to coordinated services for service-disabled veterans to the veterans' affairs commission

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- Section 1. Legislative intent. The legislature hereby recognizes that New York state's veterans, particularly those who suffered service-related disabilities, have unique needs as a result of the sacrifices they made during their military service. It is also hereby acknowledged by the legislature that due to the complexity of their needs, such individuals require accessible, coordinated, and specialized services within their communities from multiple state and local agencies. The legislature finds that there is an immediate need for a statewide comprehensive program to coordinate such services.
- 10 § 2. Section 352 of the executive law is amended by adding a new 11 subdivision 6 to read as follows:
- 12 <u>6. The state director shall submit a plan to the commission by July</u>
 13 <u>first, two thousand twenty-two, and every five years thereafter, with</u>
 14 <u>findings and recommendations to:</u>
- 15 <u>(a) promote the implementation of a comprehensive statewide program of</u> 16 coordinated services for service-disabled veterans that includes:
- 17 <u>(i) matters pertaining to educational training and retraining services</u>
 18 <u>and facilities;</u>
- 19 (ii) health, medical and rehabilitation services;
- 20 (iii) employment and re-employment services;
- 21 (iv) housing options;

EXPLANATION--Matter in italics (underscored) is new; matter in brackets [-] is old law to be omitted.

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- 1 (v) transportation options;
- 2 (vi) long term care options;
- 3 (vii) personal care;
- 4 (viii) day program service options;
- 5 (ix) family outreach; and
- 6 (x) other essential services that maximize existing resources;
- 7 (b) disseminate general information about available services to
- 8 service-disabled veterans and how such services may be accessed; and
- 9 (c) conduct an ongoing evaluation on the needs of service disabled 10 veterans.
- 11 Upon receipt of such plan from the state director, the commission
- 12 shall vote within ninety days on whether to approve, modify or reject
- 13 the plan; provided, however, if the commission modifies or rejects the
- 14 plan, the state director shall resubmit the plan to the commission with-
- 15 <u>in six months for approval.</u>
- 16 Upon approval of the plan by the commission, the state director shall
- 17 submit within thirty days of such approval a copy of the plan to the
- 18 governor, temporary president of the senate and speaker of the assembly.
- 19 § 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
