AN ACT to amend the social services law, in relation to public notice of basic rights

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- Section 1. The social services law is amended by adding a new section 1 134-c to read as follows:
- § 134-c. Requirement to publicly post information. 1. Each local 4 social services district shall be required to post information in accordance with this section, in a form and manner to be determined by 6 the commissioner. Such poster shall be conspicuous and visible to all applicants and/or recipients of public assistance who are applying for assistance and be at least eight and one-half inches by eleven inches in size. Such information shall also be posted on the office of temporary 10 <u>and disability assistance's website.</u>
- 2. Such information shall include, but not be limited to, informing 11 individuals who are applying to receive assistance that they have the 12

- 14 (a) a fair hearing;
- 15 (b) ask about emergency assistance;
