AN ACT to amend the public service law, in relation to requiring certain notices to be provided to customers receiving telephone service through fiber optic-based telephone lines

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. The public service law is amended by adding a new section 104-a to read as follows:

3 § 104-a. Notice to customers on fiber optic-based telephone lines. 1. 4 The commission shall require each telephone corporation that provides local exchange service to provide a notice containing information to customers on the differences between copper-based telephone lines and 7 fiber optic-based telephone lines prior to when such telephone corporation initiates a change in such customer's telephone service from 9 copper-based telephone lines to fiber optic-based telephone lines. 10 Except (i) in cases of an emergency, including but not limited to restoration or repair of service, or (ii) upon the request of the customer, 11 12 such notice shall be provided to the customer at least forty-five days before such telephone corporation initiates a change in such customer's 13 telephone service from copper-based telephone lines to fiber optic-based 14 15 telephone lines. Such notice shall include, but not be limited to the 16 <u>following:</u> a <u>description of the differences between copper-based tele-</u> 17 phone lines and fiber optic-based telephone lines; the differences 18 between the effect a power outage would have on the telephone service 19 provided by copper-based and fiber optic-based telephone lines, includ-20 ing the availability of battery back-up options; an explanation of

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whether the service will continue to be regulated by the commission; and a phone number and contact information for customers who seek additional information or wish to make a complaint to the commission.

- 2. The commission shall have the power to prescribe the form and content of the notice established pursuant to this section. The commission may from time to time prescribe, by order, changes in the notice thereof. The commission shall also have power to establish rules and regulations for such notice and may from time to time modify the same.
- 3. Every telephone corporation shall file with the commission the 9 10 notice established pursuant to this section and obtain approval as to 11 the form and content thereof prior to providing such notice to custom-12 ers. Notwithstanding the foregoing, any such notice shall be deemed to be approved by the commission ninety days after such corporation applies 13 14 to the commission for approval, unless the commission, or its designee, 15 rejects the notice and requires specific changes within such ninety day period. Upon a material change to the form and content of an approved 16 17 notice, a telephone corporation shall again file with the commission such notice and obtain approval pursuant to this section. The commission 18 may establish what shall constitute a material change to the form and 19 20 content of the notice that would necessitate commission approval.
- 21 § 2. This act shall take effect on the one hundred eightieth day after 22 it shall have become a law.
