AN ACT to amend the insurance law, in relation to insurance coverage of comprehensive annual medical examinations for firefighters

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- 1 Section 1. Subsection (i) of section 3216 of the insurance law is 2 amended by adding a new paragraph 36 to read as follows:
  - (36)(A) Every policy which provides medical, major medical, or similar comprehensive-type coverage shall provide coverage for comprehensive annual medical exams for insured individuals who are firefighters. Such comprehensive annual medical exam coverage shall include:
- 7 (i) a detailed symptom health history including headaches, skin rash-8 es, intestinal or respiratory symptoms, weakness, and cognitive dysfunc-9 tion;
- 10 (ii) an in person physical exam including cardiovascular, skin, 11 thyroid, mouth, pulmonary, intestinal, urinary, lymph node, neurologi-12 cal, musculoskeletal, breast and testes, as applicable, examination;
- 13 <u>(iii) vital signs and body measures tested and recorded including</u>
  14 <u>blood pressure, oxygen saturation, heart and respiratory rate, weight,</u>
  15 <u>height and body fat percentage;</u>
  - (iv) laboratory assessments including:
- 17 a. comprehensive metabolic panel, complete blood count with differen-
- 18 tial, lipid panel, thyroid stimulating hormone, high-sensitivity c-reac-
- 19 tive protein, and hemoglobin Alc blood tests; and
- 20 <u>b. urinalysis for pH, glucose, ketones, protein, blood and bilirubin,</u>
- 21 and microscopic assessment for white blood cells, red blood cells, white
- 22 blood cell casts, red blood cell casts, and crystals;

  - § 2. Subsection (1) of section 3221 of the insurance law is amended by adding a new paragraph 21 to read as follows:
  - (21)(A) Every policy which provides medical, major medical, or similar comprehensive-type coverage shall provide coverage for comprehensive annual medical exams for insured individuals who are firefighters. Such comprehensive annual medical exam coverage shall include:
  - (i) a detailed symptom health history including headaches, skin rashes, intestinal or respiratory symptoms, weakness, and cognitive dysfunc-
- 31 (ii) an in person physical exam including cardiovascular, skin, 32 thyroid, mouth, pulmonary, intestinal, urinary, lymph node, neurological, musculoskeletal, breast and testes, as applicable, examination; 33
- 34 (iii) vital signs and body measures tested and recorded including blood pressure, oxygen saturation, heart and respiratory rate, weight, 35 36 height and body fat percentage;
  - (iv) laboratory assessments including:
  - a. comprehensive metabolic panel, complete blood count with differential, lipid panel, thyroid stimulating hormone, high-sensitivity c-reactive protein, and hemoglobin Alc blood tests; and
- b. urinalysis for pH, glucose, ketones, protein, blood and bilirubin, 41 42 and microscopic assessment for white blood cells, red blood cells, white 43 blood cell casts, red blood cell casts, and crystals;

- (D) As used in this paragraph the term "firefighter" means any fire-fighter regularly employed by a fire department of any municipality in the state.
- 10  $\S$  3. Section 4303 of the insurance law is amended by adding a new 11 subsection (1-2) to read as follows:
- 12 (1-2)(A) Every contract which provides medical, major medical, or 13 similar comprehensive-type coverage shall provide coverage for compre-14 hensive annual medical exams for insured individuals who are firefight-15 ers. Such comprehensive annual medical exam coverage shall include:
