AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to excluding certain graduate students from mandatory fees

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Paragraph h of subdivision 2 of section 355 of the education law is amended by adding a new subparagraph 11 to read as follows:

- (11) All current and future mandatory fees owed on or after January 4 first, two thousand twenty-three, with the exclusion of the graduate 5 student association student activities fee, shall not be charged to a graduate student serving a full-time or half-time appointment as a graduate teaching assistant, graduate assistant, graduate research assistant, graduate research associate, or a graduate teaching associate.
- § 2. Subdivision 7 of section 6206 of the education law is amended by 10 adding a new subparagraph (g) to read as follows:
- (q) All current and future mandatory fees owed on or after January 11 first, two thousand twenty-three, with the exclusion of the graduate 12 13 student association student activities fee, shall not be charged to a 14 graduate student serving as a graduate assistant, adjunct instructor, 15 <u>adjunct lecturer</u>, <u>adjunct college laboratory technician or a non-teach-</u>
- 16 <u>ing adjunct staff member.</u>
