KAPLAN -- read twice and ordered printed, and when printed to be committed to the Committee on Local Government -- reported favorably from said committee, ordered to first and second report, ordered to a third reading, amended and ordered reprinted, retaining its place in the order of third reading

AN ACT relating to establishing the Nassau county and Queens county border task force, and providing for its powers and duties; and providing for the repeal of such provisions upon expiration thereof

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. A task force, to be known as the Nassau county and Queens
2 county border task force, is hereby created to examine, investigate, and
3 review such issues as are related to jurisdiction and boundary disputes
4 of such counties.

5 § 2. The task force shall have the power to:

6 (a) conduct public hearings in furtherance of the performance of its
7 duties under this act;

8 (b) request the attendance of witnesses and the production of books,
9 records, documents, and other relevant information; and

10 (c) to recommend legislation consistent with the purposes of this
11 section.

12 § 3. The task force shall consist of seven members appointed by the
13 governor as follows:

14 (a) one member appointed on the recommendation of the temporary presi-
15 dent of the senate;

16 (b) one member appointed on the recommendation of the speaker of the
17 assembly;

18 (c) one member appointed on the recommendation of the minority leader
19 of the senate;

EXPLANATION--Matter in italics (underscored) is new; matter in brackets

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1 (d) one member appointed on the recommendation of the minority leader
2 of the assembly;

3 (e) one member appointed on the recommendation of the county executive
4 of the county of Nassau;

5 (f) one member appointed on the recommendation of the borough presi-
6 dent of the county of Queens; and

7 (g) one member appointed on the recommendation of the superintendent
8 of the state police.

9 § 4. There shall be two chairpersons selected from among the members
10 of the Nassau county and Queens county border task force. One chair-
11 person shall be selected by the county executive of the county of
12 Nassau, and one chairperson shall be selected by the borough president
13 of the county of Queens. Such chairpersons shall schedule the first
14 meeting of the task force, which shall be held no later than sixty days
15 after the effective date of this act.

16 § 5. The members of the Nassau county and Queens county border task
17 force shall serve without compensation.

18 § 6. The state police shall provide the Nassau county and Queens coun-
19 ty border task force with such data obtained by the department as the
20 task force may require to carry out its duties. To the extent practica-
21 ble, such data shall be provided in a format in accordance with the
22 standards outlined in the New York state open data handbook pursuant to
23 executive order ninety-five of two thousand thirteen.

24 § 7. The Nassau county and Queens county border task force shall issue
25 a report of its findings and recommendations to the governor, the tempo-
26 rary president of the senate and the speaker of the assembly no later
27 than January 1, 2023.

28 § 8. This act shall take effect immediately and shall expire and be
29 deemed repealed two years after such effective date, or upon delivery of
30 the report required by section seven of this act, whichever comes first;
31 provided that the Nassau county and Queens county border task force
32 shall notify the legislative bill drafting commission upon delivery of
33 the report required by section seven of this act in order that the
34 commission may maintain an accurate and timely effective data base of
35 the official text of the laws of the state of New York in furtherance of
36 effectuating the provisions of section 44 of the legislative law and
37 section 70-b of the public officers law.
