AN ACT to amend chapter 589 of the laws of 2015, amending the insurance law relating to catastrophic or reinsurance coverage issued to certain small groups, in relation to the effectiveness thereof; and to amend chapter 588 of the laws of 2015, amending the insurance law relating to catastrophic or reinsurance coverage issued to certain small groups, in relation to the effectiveness thereof

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- Section 1. Section 5 of chapter 589 of the laws of 2015, amending the 2 insurance law relating to catastrophic or reinsurance coverage issued to certain small groups, as amended by section 1 of item E of subpart H of part XXX of chapter 58 of the laws of 2020, is amended to read as follows:
 - § 5. This act shall take effect on the same date and in the same manner as chapter 588 of the laws of 2015, takes effect and shall be deemed repealed [seven] ten years thereafter.
- § 2. Section 5 of chapter 588 of the laws of 2015, amending the insur-10 ance law relating to catastrophic or reinsurance coverage issued to certain small groups, as amended by section 2 of item E of subpart H of 12 part XXX of chapter 58 of the laws of 2020, is amended to read as 13 follows:
- 14 § 5. This act shall take effect immediately; and shall be deemed 15 repealed [7] ten years after it shall have become a law.
- 16 § 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
