AN ACT to amend the parks, recreation and historic preservation law, in relation to the development and posting of a senior trail guide that identifies walking and hiking opportunities for active seniors within the state park system and along public non-motorized multi-use trails within the state

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 3.09 of the parks, recreation and historic preser-2 vation law is amended by adding a new subdivision 24 to read as follows: 24. Shall develop and post on its website a senior trail quide that 3 identifies walking and hiking opportunities for active seniors within 4 the state park system and along public non-motorized multi-use trails 5 6 within the state. Such guide shall include, but not be limited to: iden-7 tification of low impact trails and routes appropriately accessible for 8 patrons aged sixty-two years and older; listing of any impediments to mobility along such identified trails or routes such as steep inclines, 9 10 declines, or uneven terrain; and identification of corresponding activities or amenities along or in close proximity to such trails and routes 11 12 <u>such as the location of birding areas or geologically or historically</u> 13 significant sites. The office shall update the senior trail quide from 14 time to time.

§ 2. This act shall take effect on the one hundred eightieth day after 16 it shall have become a law.
