AN ACT to amend the executive law, in relation to establishing an expert insurance liaison in the department of homeland security and emergency services and a communication relay system

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 2 of section 709 of the executive law is  
2 amended by adding two new paragraphs (g-1) and (g-2) to read as follows:

3 (g-1) establish the position of expert insurance coordinator to coor-  
4 ordinate and facilitate information sharing among local, state, and feder-  
5 al agencies to improve coordination with insurance companies with  
6 respect to disaster response to natural and man-made disasters;

7 (g-2) establish a communication relay system between the division of  
8 homeland security and emergency services, department of financial  
9 services, and insurance companies during a natural or man-made disaster  
10 so communication between the organizations can be efficient and effec-  
11 tive in real time. A biannual report shall be drafted by the division of  
12 homeland security and emergency services, department of financial  
13 services and the insurance coordinator on what is considered insured and  
14 what is considered uninsured by the insurance companies;

15 § 2. This act shall take effect on the one hundred twentieth day after  
16 it shall have become a law. Effective immediately, the addition, amend-  
17 ment and/or repeal of any rule or regulation necessary for the implemen-  
18 tation of this act on its effective date are authorized to be made and  
19 completed on or before such effective date.
