- AN ACT to authorize James Unger to receive certain credit under section 384-d of the retirement and social security law

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, James Unger, 1 2 currently a town of West Seneca police officer and member of the New York state and local police and fire retirement system covered by section 384-d of the retirement and social security law, who between 3 4 5 January 21, 2003 and September 6, 2006 was employed by the Erie county 6 sheriff's department where he was a member of the New York state and 7 local employees' retirement system, and who, for reasons not ascribable 8 to his own negligence, was not granted service credit under section 9 384-d of the retirement and social security law for his period of 10 employment with the Erie county sheriff's department, shall be granted 11 such service credit under section 384-d of the retirement and social 12 security law and shall be entitled to the full rights and benefits asso-13 ciated with coverage under such section, provided a request to that effect is filed with the state comptroller within one year from the effective date of this act. Prior to James Unger submitting such 14 15 16 request, he must first file an application for tier reinstatement with 17 the New York state and local police and fire retirement system, as he 18 has previously withdrawn his membership with the New York state and 19 local employees' retirement system. Once any costs associated with James 20 Unger's tier reinstatement to his prior membership are paid in full by 21 him, he may be granted the service credit and such service credit will

2	security law for James Unger.
3	§ 2. All past service costs incurred in implementing the provisions of
4	this act shall be borne by the town of West Seneca.
5	§ 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
б	FISCAL NOTEPursuant to Legislative Law, Section 50:
7	This bill would grant service credit under section 384-d together with
8	384-e of the Retirement and Social Security Law to James Unger, a
9	current member of the New York State and Local Police and Fire Retire-
10	ment System (PFRS), for the period of January 21, 2003 through September
11	6, 2006, while employed as a deputy sheriff for Erie County. Currently,
12	deputy sheriff service is not creditable in a PFRS twenty-year police
13	retirement plan. James Unger is currently employed by the Town of West
14	Seneca.
15	If this bill is enacted during the 2022 legislative session, there
16	will be an immediate past service cost of approximately 208,000 which
17	will be borne by the Town of West Seneca as a one-time payment. This
18	estimate is based on the assumption that payment will be made on Febru-
19	ary 1, 2023.
20	Summary of relevant resources:
21	Membership data as of March 31, 2021 was used in measuring the impact
22	of the proposed change, the same data used in the April 1, 2021 actuari-
23	al valuation. Distributions and other statistics can be found in the
24	2021 Report of the Actuary and the 2021 Comprehensive Annual Financial
25	Report.
26	The actuarial assumptions and methods used are described in the 2020
27	and 2021 Annual Report to the Comptroller on Actuarial Assumptions, and
28	the Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York: Audit and
29	Control.
