AN ACT to amend the environmental conservation law, in relation to enacting the birds and bees protection act

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Short title. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "birds and bees protection act".

§ 2. Section 33-1301 of the environmental conservation law is amended by adding a new subdivision 13 to read as follows:

13. a. Beginning January first, two thousand twenty-five, for any person to sell, offer for sale or use, or distribute within the state any corn, soybean or wheat seeds coated or treated with pesticides with the active ingredients clothianidin, imidacloprid, thiamethoxam, dinotefuran, or acetamiprid; provided, however, that the provisions of this 10 paragraph shall not apply to a corn, soybean or wheat seed for which the

- 11 commissioner, in consultation with the commissioner of agriculture and markets, determines after opportunity for public notice and comment that
- 13 no acceptable alternative exists. For purposes of this paragraph, "no

14 <u>acceptable alternative" shall mean that:</u>

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- (i) no seed that has not been treated with the active ingredients clothianidin, imidacloprid, thiamethoxam, dinotefuran or acetamiprid is commercially available or reasonably anticipated to become commercially available; or
- (ii) the purchase of seed that complies with the requirements of this paragraph would result in undue financial hardship to agricultural producers.
- b. (1) No person shall apply or treat outdoor ornamental plants and turf, except for the production of agricultural commodities, with a pesticide containing:
- 11 (i) the active ingredients imidacloprid, thiamethoxam or acetamiprid 12 on or after July first, two thousand twenty-four;
- (ii) the active ingredients clothianidin or dinotefuran effective 13 14 immediately.
- (2) a. The provisions of this paragraph shall not apply where the commissioner, in consultation with the department of agriculture and 17 markets, by written order, determines that:
 - (i) a valid environmental emergency exists;
 - (ii) the pesticide would be effective in addressing the environmental emergency; and
 - (iii) no other, less harmful pesticide or pest management practice would be effective in addressing the environmental emergency.
 - b. Any such order shall include the basis for the commissioner's determination and specify the approved time period, geographic scope, and purpose of the permitted use of such pesticide. An order issued pursuant to this section shall be valid for a period not to exceed six months.
 - c. For the purposes of this subdivision "environmental emergency" means: an occurrence of any pest which presents a significant risk of harm or injury to the environment, or significant harm, injury, or loss to agricultural crops, including, but not limited to, any exotic or foreign pest which may need preventative quarantine measures to avert or prevent that risk, as determined by the department in consultation with the department of agriculture and markets.
- § 3. The department of environmental conservation, in consultation 35 36 with the department of agriculture and markets, New York state's land 37 grant university, and state university of New York college of environmental science and forestry shall conduct a study to identify practica-38 ble and feasible alternatives to the use of pesticides containing the 39 active ingredients clothianidin, imidacloprid, thiamethoxam, dinotefuran 40 or acetamiprid. The results of the study shall be submitted to the 41 42 governor, the temporary president of the senate and the speaker of the 43 assembly on or before January 1, 2023 and shall be posted on the depart-44 ment's public website.
- 45 § 4. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall 46 have become a law. Effective immediately, the addition, amendment and/or 47 repeal of any rule or regulation necessary for the implementation of this act on its effective date are authorized to be made and completed 49 on or before such date.
