AN ACT to amend the mental hygiene law, in relation to the autism detection and education program and mapping of autism locations; and to amend a chapter of the laws of 2021 amending the mental hygiene law relating to the autism detection and education program and mapping of autism locations, as proposed in legislative bills numbers S. 2911 and A. 1953, in relation to the effectiveness thereof

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Subdivisions (d), (e), (f) and (g) of section 13.42 of the 2 mental hygiene law, as amended by a chapter of the laws of 2021 amending the mental hygiene law relating to the autism detection and education program and mapping of autism locations, as proposed in legislative 5 bills numbers S. 2911 and A. 1953, are amended to read as follows:

(d) [(1) There is hereby created within the board the autism detection, education and mapping program. This program is established] The board shall meet quarterly to [promote] discuss screening and detection of autism, how to [educate] promote education of the public regarding 10 autism, to [provide] promote counseling and referral services and to [map discuss and report on previously mapped locations of occurrence of 12 autism as provided for in the recent autism mapping study completed by 13 the State and City Universities of New York and published in the Journal 14 of Neurodevelopmental Disorders, entitled "Exploratory spatial analysis 15 of autism rates in New York school districts".

[(2) The program shall include the:

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(i) establishment of a statewide public education and outreach campaign to publicize autism detection and education services, such 19 campaign shall include: general community education, autism screening 20 services, information on the extent of coverage for such services by 21 health insurance, any available medical assistance program and other 22 public and private programs.

(ii) provision of grants to approved organizations under subdivision 24 (e) of this section; and

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compilation of data concerning the autism detection, education 1 and mapping program including mapping of the frequency of the occurrence 2 3 of autism in various locations in the state and dissemination of the data to the public. 4 5 (e)[(1) The board shall make grants within the amounts appropriated to 6 approved organizations, as defined in paragraph two of this subdivision, 7 for the provision of services relating to autism screening, detection 8 and mapping as part of this program. Such services shall include but not 9 be limited to the: 10 (i) promotion and provision of detection of autism; (ii) provision of counseling and information on treatment options and 11 referral for appropriate medical treatment; 12 13 (iii) dissemination of information to the general public and to health 14 care professionals concerning autism, the benefits of detection and treatment, and the availability of autism services; 15 (iv) identification of local autism screening scrvices within the 16 17 approved organization's region; (v) provision of information, counseling and referral services to 18 individuals diagnosed with autism; and 19 20 (vi) mapping of the frequency of the occurrence of autism in various 21 locations of the state. 22 (2) For the purposes of this section, "approved organization" shall mean an organization approved by the board, to provide services under 23 this subdivision. Such organizations shall include, but not be limited 24 25 to, the following: (i) a hospital licensed under article twenty-eight of the public 26 27 health law; (ii) a health maintenance organization licensed under article forty-28 three of the insurance law or certified under article forty-four of the 29 30 public health law; 31 (iii) an organization with program expertise in autism related issues; 32 (iv) a county or city health department; or (v) any combination of the above. 33 (3) The board shall develop recommendations for the implementation of 34 autism detection, education and mapping programs by approved organiza-35 36 tions which shall ensure the following: 37 (i) integration of the approved organization with existing health care 38 providers; 39 (ii) maximizing third party reimbursement; and (iii) providing data collection for mapping of the occurrence of 40 autism in various locations of the state. 41 42 (f) Such board shall meet at least quarterly. | Special meetings may be 43 called by the chair. The agenda and meeting place of all regular or 44 special meetings shall be made available to the public in advance of 45 such meetings. 46 $[\frac{\{g\}}{g}]$ (f) The advisory board shall submit a written report to the 47 48 49 50

governor, the temporary president of the senate and the speaker of the assembly by no later than October first of the year next succeeding the effective date of this section and annually thereafter, setting forth the recommendations and activities of the council on matters within the 51 scope of its duties as set forth in this section. Such annual report 52 shall also include information concerning the [operation of the autism detection, education and mapping program, and the experience of the 53 program in providing detection, education and mapping of the frequency 55 of the oggurrence of autism discussion of screening and detection of autism, how to promote education of the public regarding autism, to S. 7815

promote counseling and referral services, and to discuss previously mapped locations of the occurrence of autism in various locations around the state[. Approved organizations shall provide such data and assessment as the board may require for such report] as detailed in the recent autism mapping study completed by the State and City Universities of New York, and published in the Journal of Neurodevelopmental Disorders, entitled "Exploratory spatial analysis of autism rates in New York school districts". Such report shall [also] include any recommendations for additional action to respond to the high incidence of autism in this state.

- § 2. Section 2 of a chapter of the laws of 2021 amending the mental hygiene law relating to the autism detection and education program and mapping of autism locations, as proposed in legislative bills numbers S. 2911 and A. 1953, is amended to read as follows:
- § 2. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall have become a law and shall expire and be deemed repealed on December 31, 2022. Effective immediately, the addition, amendment and/or repeal of any rule or regulation necessary for the implementation of this act on its effective date are authorized to be made and completed on or before such effective date.
- 21 § 3. This act shall take effect on the same date and in the same 22 manner as a chapter of the laws of 2021 amending the mental hygiene law 23 relating to the autism detection and education program and mapping of 24 autism locations, as proposed in legislative bills numbers S. 2911 and 25 A. 1953, takes effect.
