Introduced by Sens. HINCHEY, GALLIVAN, OBERACKER, THOMAS -- read twice and ordered printed, and when printed to be committed to the Committee on Health -- committee discharged, bill amended, ordered reprinted as amended and recommitted to said committee

AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to establishing a statewide advance care planning campaign to promote public awareness of hospice and palliative care services; and to repeal certain provisions of such law related thereto

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Paragraph (e) of subdivision 1 of section 207 of the public 2 health law, as amended by section 16 of part A of chapter 109 of the 3 laws of 2010, is amended to read as follows:

- (e) The <u>commissioner shall establish a statewide advance care plan-</u>
  <u>ning campaign to:</u>
- (i) promote public awareness of hospice and palliative care services; and palliative care options for patients with a terminal illness or condition;
- 9 <u>(ii) inform the public of the importance of advance care planning and</u>
  10 <u>the individual's right to direct and participate in health care deci-</u>
  11 <u>sions affecting the individual;</u>
- 12 <u>(iii) educate individuals on the tools available to ensure their</u> 13 <u>health care decisions are honored; and</u>
- (iv) the need and importance for consumers and patients to have an advance directive, particularly a health care proxy, and the need and importance for health care providers to play a leadership role in discussing end-of-life care preferences and values with patients and to provide patients with health care proxy forms.
- 19 § 2. Paragraph (h) of subdivision 1 of section 207 of the public 20 health law is REPEALED.
- § 3. This act shall take effect on the one hundred eightieth day after it shall have become a law. Effective immediately, the addition, amendment and/or repeal of any rule or regulation necessary for the implementation of this act on its effective date are authorized to be made and
- 25 completed on or before such effective date.
