AN ACT to amend the uniform justice court act and the town law, in relation to requiring certain town and village justices be admitted to practice law in the state

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Section 105 of the uniform justice court act is amended by 2 adding a new subdivision (a-1) to read as follows:

(a-1) Education. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the 3 4 contrary, a town or village justice selected for a term of office in a 5 town or village with a high volume caseload shall be admitted to prac-6 tice law in the state. For the purposes of this subdivision, "town or 7 village with a high volume caseload" shall mean the fifty highest volume caseloads in town and village courts in the state as determined by the 9 office of court administration in consultation with the division of 10 criminal justice services. Any change in the requirements for eligibility to serve as a town or village justice in such town or village shall 11 12 take effect upon commencement of the next judicial term of office following the designation as a town or village with a high volume case-13 14 load.

15 § 2. Section 31 of the town law is amended by adding a new subdivision 16 2-a to read as follows:

2-a. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, a town justice selected for a term of office in a town with a high volume caseload, as determined pursuant to subdivision (a-1) of section one hundred five of the uniform justice court act, shall be admitted to practice law in the state. Any change in the requirements for eligibility to serve as a town justice in such town shall take effect upon commencement of the next judicial term of office following the designation as a town with a high volume caseload.

25 § 3. This act shall take effect on the first of January next succeed-26 ing the date on which it shall have become a law.
