AN ACT to amend the agriculture and markets law, in relation to establishing the New York state meat processing grant expansion program

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. The agriculture and markets law is amended by adding a new
2 section 96-k to read as follows:

3 § 96-k. New York state meat processing grant program. 1.
4 There is hereby established within the department a New York state meat
5 processing expansion grant program. The program shall be established by
6 the department, in consultation with the empire state development corpo-
7 ration. The purpose of the program shall be to provide grants to encour-
8 age the expansion of meat processing enterprises throughout the state,
9 with an emphasis on the establishment of more processing plants that are
10 certified by the United States department of agriculture.

11 2. The department shall establish program requirements and create an
12 application form for the program within sixty days of the effective date
13 of this section. Such program requirements shall include, but need not
14 be limited to;

15 (a) Proposals for grants shall be for no less than fifty thousand
16 dollars and shall be used for the expansion of existing plants, creation
17 of new plants, job training, safety upgrades, or other purpose deemed
18 necessary to further opportunities for beef, pork and other meat farmers
19 to process their meat within the state; and

20 (b) Funds allocated to the department for the grant program shall be
21 divided among each regional economic development council region that is
22 able to disperse five hundred thousand dollars each to one or multiple
23 entities who can prove need for one-time capital funding to increase
24 meat processing capabilities within the state.

25 3. The department shall promote the program throughout the state.

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1 4. Grant program funds shall be allocated within one year of the
2 effective date of this section.

3 § 2. This act shall take effect the first of April next succeeding the
4 date on which it shall have become a law; provided, however, that the
5 implementation of the provisions of this act shall be subject to the
6 appropriation of moneys specifically for the purposes thereof.
