- AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to the practice of dental assisting

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Section 6608 of the education law, as amended by chapter 2 390 of the laws of 2019, is amended to read as follows:

§ 6608. Definition of practice of registered dental assisting. The 3 4 practice of registered dental assisting is defined as providing support-5 ive services to a dentist in his or her performance of dental services authorized under this article. Such support shall include providing б 7 patient education, taking preliminary medical histories and vital signs 8 to be reviewed by the dentist, placing and removing rubber dams, select-9 ing and prefitting provisional crowns, selecting and prefitting orthodontic bands, removing orthodontic arch wires and ligature ties, placing 10 11 and removing matrix bands, taking impressions for study casts or diag-12 nostic casts, removing periodontal dressings, placing and removing temporary restorations, and such other dental supportive services 13 14 authorized by the dentist consistent with regulations promulgated by the 15 commissioner, provided that such functions are performed under the direct personal supervision of a licensed dentist in the course of the 16 17 performance of dental services. Such services shall not include diagnosing and/or performing surgical procedures, irreversible procedures or 18 procedures that would alter the hard or soft tissue of the oral and 19 20 maxillofacial area or any other procedures determined by the department. 21 The practice of registered dental assisting may be conducted in the 22 office of any licensed dentist or in any appropriately equipped school 23 or public institution but must be done under the direct personal super-24 vision of a licensed dentist. Direct personal supervision, for purposes 25 of this section, means supervision of dental procedures based on 26 instructions given by a licensed dentist in the course of a procedure

1 who remains in the dental office where the supportive services are being 2 performed, personally diagnoses the condition to be treated, personally authorizes the procedures, and before dismissal of the patient, who 3 remains the responsibility of the licensed dentist, evaluates the 4 5 services performed by the registered dental assistant. Nothing herein 6 authorizes a registered dental assistant to perform any of the services 7 or functions defined as part of the practice of dental hygiene in 8 accordance with the provisions of subdivision one of section sixty-six 9 hundred six of this article, except those functions authorized pursuant 10 to this section. All dental supportive services provided in this section 11 may be performed by currently registered dental hygienists either under 12 a dentist's supervision, as defined in regulations of the commissioner, or, in the case of a registered dental hygienist working for a hospital 13 14 as defined in article twenty-eight of the public health law, pursuant to 15 a collaborative arrangement with a licensed dentist in accordance with subdivision one of section sixty-six hundred six of this article. Such 16 17 collaborative arrangement shall not obviate or supersede any law or 18 regulation which requires identified services to be performed under the personal supervision of a dentist. 19
