AN ACT to amend the public authorities law and the criminal procedure law, in relation to authorizing the Syracuse regional airport authority to designate certain employees as peace officers

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Section 2799-ggg of the public authorities law is amended
2 by adding a new subdivision 12-a to read as follows:

3 12-a. to appoint or designate one or more persons for the purpose of
4 enforcing rules and regulations established by the authority, and to
5 compel the observance of law and order on the properties and facilities
6 of the authority for the protection and administration of such proper-
7 ties and facilities. Each person as and when so appointed or designated
8 shall be known as a "Syracuse regional airport authority security offi-
9 cer" and shall be a peace officer as set forth in subdivision eighty-six
10 of section 2.10 of the criminal procedure law, or a police officer if so
11 designated by the authority in accordance with paragraph (e) of subdivi-
12 sion thirty-four of section 1.20 of the criminal procedure law;

13 § 2. Section 2.10 of the criminal procedure law is amended by adding a
14 new subdivision 86 to read as follows:

15 86. Security officers appointed and designated as peace officers by
16 the Syracuse regional airport authority, pursuant to subdivision
17 twelve-a of section twenty-seven hundred ninety-nine-ggg of the public
18 authorities law; provided, however, that nothing in this subdivision
19 shall be deemed to authorize such officer to carry, possess, repair or
20 dispose of a firearm unless the appropriate license therefor has been
21 issued pursuant to section 400.00 of the penal law.

22 § 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
