AN ACT to amend the racing, pari-mutuel wagering and breeding law, in relation to antitrust exemptions for horse racing agreements

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. The racing, pari-mutuel wagering and breeding law is amended by adding a new section 113-a to read as follows:

2 amended by adding a new section 113-a to read as follows: 3 § 113-a. Antitrust exemptions. State and federal antitrust laws shall 4 not apply to any joint agreement entered into, in consultation with and jointly approved by the state gaming commission and the attorney general, by or among non-profit racing associations, thoroughbred racing 7 associations or corporations, harness racing associations or corporations, quarter horse racing associations or corporations, and regional 9 off-track betting corporations to coordinate the dates and times under which they will conduct programs of racing and offer pari-mutuel wager-10 ing. In addition, such antitrust laws shall not apply to joint agree-11 ments entered into, in consultation with and jointly approved by the 12 state gaming commission and the attorney general, by or among non-profit 13 14 racing associations, thoroughbred racing associations or corporations, 15 harness racing associations or corporations, quarter horse racing associations or corporations, and regional off-track betting corporations to 16 sell, transfer, assign or purchase the rights to broadcast, simulcast, 17 electronically transmit or offer pari-mutuel wagering on horse races. 18 19 The state gaming commission and the attorney general shall jointly 20 consider and approve such agreements and the terms therein to further 21 the state's interest in ensuring the viability and continued existence 22 in this state of the horse racing and agriculture industries.

23 § 2. This act shall take effect on the one hundred eightieth day after 24 it shall have become a law.
