AN ACT to amend the social services law, in relation to providing internet access to all individuals receiving temporary housing assistance

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 17 of the social services law is amended by adding 2 a new subdivision (m) to read as follows:

(m) require that each local social services district shall provide 4 internet access to all individuals receiving temporary housing assist-5 ance in such district. For purposes of this subdivision, temporary housing assistance shall include but not be limited to, a family shelter, a shelter for adults, a domestic violence shelter, a runaway and homeless youth shelter, or a safe house for refugees. Each local social services district shall submit their plan to provide internet access pursuant to 10 this subdivision to the department for oversight and approval within 11 thirty days of the effective date of this act. Shelters shall implement and comply with such plans within eighteen months of such approval.

- § 2. Section 153 of the social services law is amended by adding a new 14 subdivision 13 to read as follows:
- 13. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, one 16 hundred percent of the cost for the expense incurred for local social 17 services districts to provide internet access as required by subdivision (m) of section seventeen of this chapter shall be reimbursed by the 19 state.
- 20 § 3. This act shall take effect on the thirtieth day after it shall 21 have become a law. Effective immediately, the addition, amendment and/or 22 repeal of any rule or regulation necessary for the implementation of this act on its effective date are authorized to be made and completed 24 on or before such effective date.
