- Introduced by M. of A. QUART, LAVINE, GOODELL, LUPARDO -- Multi-Sponsored by -- M. of A. ABBATE, SOLAGES -- read once and referred to the Committee on Libraries and Education Technology
- AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to aid for coordinated collection development grants for public and non-profit independent colleges and universities

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Legislative findings. The formula directing state aid to 2 public and private academic and research libraries has not been adjusted since 1984. During that time prices of published academic materials have 3 outpaced inflation, often rising at a rate of more than three times that 4 5 of inflation. The state provides aid to these libraries for the purpose б of improving access and resources in a coordinated manner. This program needs an adjustment in its formula if the goals of quality and accessi-7 8 ble scholarship are to be maintained. Therefore, it is in the best interests of the state, its citizens and long-term academic and economic 9 10 prospects to support modernization of the coordinated collection devel-11 opment aid (CCDA) formula.

12 § 2. Subdivision 5 of section 273 of the education law, as amended by 13 section 3 of part 0 of chapter 57 of the laws of 2005, is amended to 14 read as follows:

15 5. Coordinated collection development program for public and nonprofit 16 independent colleges and universities.

17 a. Libraries of public and nonprofit independent colleges and univer-18 sities are entitled to receive annual funding for a coordinated 19 collection development grant if they meet the following conditions:

20 (1) Membership in a reference and research library resources system,

21 (2) Their resources are made available to the public, through full 22 participation in the interlibrary loan and other resource sharing

16	seventy-five dollars for each institution in fiscal year two thousand
17	twenty-twotwo thousand twenty-three, eight thousand six hundred
18	dollars for each institution in fiscal year two thousand twenty-three
19	two thousand twenty-four, ten thousand dollars for each institution in
20 21	fiscal year two thousand twenty-fourtwo thousand twenty-five, and (2) One dollar and four cents for each full-time equivalent student
21 22	(2) One dollar and four cents for each full-time equivalent student enrolled in each qualifying institution, in the academic year completed
23	prior to [the] state fiscal year two thousand twenty-onetwo thousand
24	twenty-two. Thereafter the rate shall be set at the level of the previ-
25	ous fiscal year indexed to any positive growth in the Consumer Price
26	Index as set by the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics. For
27	purposes of this section, a full-time equivalent shall be calculated as
28	follows:
29	(i) one full-time undergraduate student shall be considered one full-
30	time equivalent student;
31	(ii) one part-time undergraduate student shall be considered one-third
32	of a full-time equivalent student;
33	(iii) one part-time graduate student shall be considered one full-time
34	equivalent student; and
35	(iv) one full-time graduate student shall be considered one and one-
36	half of a full-time equivalent student.
37 38	c. Funds for the support of this program shall be appropriated to the department, except that funds for the state-operated institutions of the

43	shall be appropriated to the city university of New York out of any

46	to the same distribution formula as provided in paragraph b of this
