AN ACT to amend the elder law, in relation to directing the office of the state long-term care ombudsman to provide opportunities for volunteers to work as resident advocates within the long-term care ombudsman program (Part A); to amend the public health law, in relation to directing the commissioner of health, in consultation with the long-term care ombudsman, to establish policies and procestate for reporting, by staff and volunteers of the long-term care dures ombudsman program, issues concerning the health and safety of resihomes and residential health care facilities dents at nursing (Part B); and to amend the public health law, in relation to including access to state long-term care ombudsman program staff and volunteers within the pandemic emergency plan prepared by residential health care facilities (Part C)

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Short title. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "long-term care ombudsman program reform act".

3 § 2. Legislative intent. This act enacts into law legislation relating 4 to the long-term care ombudsman program. Each component is wholly contained within a Part identified as Parts A through C. The effective 5 date for each particular provision contained within such Part is set forth in the last section of such Part. Any provision in any section 6 7 contained within a Part, including the effective date of the Part, which 8 makes a reference to a section "of this act", when used in connection 9 10 with that particular component, shall be deemed to mean and refer to the 11 corresponding section of the Part in which it is found. Section four of 12 this act sets forth the general effective date of this act.

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## PART C

4 Section 1. Subparagraph (i) of paragraph (a) of subdivision 12 of 5 section 2803 of the public health law is amended by adding a new clause 6 (C) to read as follows:

(C) that includes a method to provide all residents with access, at no
cost, to state long-term care ombudsman program staff and volunteers,
and that provides state long-term care ombudsman program staff and
volunteers with access to the facility; and

11 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

12 § 3. Severability clause. If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivi-13 sion, section or part of this act shall be adjudged by any court of 14 competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgement shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in 15 its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section 16 or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such 17 18 judgement shall have been rendered. It is hereby declared to be the 19 intent of the legislature that this act would have been enacted even if 20 such invalid provisions had not been included herein.

§ 4. This act shall take effect immediately provided, however, that the applicable effective date of Parts A through C of this act shall be as specifically set forth in the last section of such Parts.
