AN ACT to amend the insurance law, in relation to coverage for the screening, diagnosis and treatment of autism spectrum disorder

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Subparagraphs (B) and (C) of paragraph 25 of subsection 2 (i) of section 3216 of the insurance law, subparagraph (B) as amended by 3 section 2 of subpart A of part BB of chapter 57 of the laws of 2019, 4 subparagraph (C) as amended by chapter 596 of the laws of 2011, items 5 (i) and (iii) of subparagraph (C) as amended by section 3 of subpart A 6 of part BB of chapter 57 of the laws of 2019, are amended to read as 7 follows:

(B) Every policy that provides physician services, medical, major 8 9 medical or similar comprehensive-type coverage shall provide coverage for the screening, diagnosis and treatment of autism spectrum disorder 10 11 in accordance with this paragraph and shall not exclude coverage for the 12 screening, diagnosis or treatment of medical conditions otherwise 13 covered by the policy because the individual is diagnosed with autism 14 spectrum disorder. Such coverage may be subject to annual deductibles, 15 copayments and coinsurance as may be deemed appropriate by the superintendent and shall be consistent with those imposed on other benefits 16 17 under the policy. Coverage for applied behavior analysis and developmental, individual-differences, relationship-based treatment shall be 18 19 subject to a maximum benefit of six hundred eighty hours of treatment 20 per policy or calendar year per covered individual. This paragraph shall 21 not be construed as limiting the benefits that are otherwise available 22 to an individual under the policy, provided however that such policy 23 shall not contain any limitations on visits that are solely applied to 24 the treatment of autism spectrum disorder. No insurer shall terminate 25 coverage or refuse to deliver, execute, issue, amend, adjust, or renew

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coverage to an individual solely because the individual is diagnosed 1 with autism spectrum disorder or has received treatment for autism spec-2 trum disorder. Coverage shall be subject to utilization review and 3 4 external appeals of health care services pursuant to article forty-nine 5 of this chapter as well as case management and other managed care 6 provisions. 7 (C) For purposes of this paragraph: "autism spectrum disorder" means any pervasive developmental 8 (i) 9 disorder as defined in the most recent edition of the diagnostic and statistical manual of mental disorders, including autistic disorder, 10 Asperger's disorder, Rett's disorder, childhood disintegrative disorder, 11 12 or pervasive developmental disorder not otherwise specified. (ii) "applied behavior analysis" means the design, implementation, and 13 14 evaluation of environmental modifications, using behavioral stimuli and 15 consequences, to produce socially significant improvement in human 16 behavior, including the use of direct observation, measurement, and 17 functional analysis of the relationship between environment and behav-18 ior. (iii) "behavioral health treatment" means counseling and treatment programs, <u>including developmental, individual-differences, relation-</u> 19 20 21 ship-based treatment and applied behavioral analysis, when provided by a 22 licensed provider with a professional certificate in developmental, individual-differences, relationship-based treatment from the interdis-23 ciplinary council on development and learning, and applied behavior 24 25 analysis, when provided or supervised by a [person licensed, certified or otherwise authorized to provide applied behavior analysis,] behavior 26 27 analyst certified pursuant to the behavior analyst certification board, 28 that are necessary to develop, maintain, or restore, to the maximum 29 extent practicable, the functioning of an individual. Individuals that 30 provide behavioral health treatment under the supervision of a licensed provider or a certified behavior analyst pursuant to this paragraph 31 shall be subject to standards of professionalism, supervision and rele-32 33 vant experience pursuant to regulations promulgated by the superintendent in consultation with the commissioners of health and education. 34 (iv) "diagnosis of autism spectrum disorder" means assessments, evalu-35 36 ations, or tests to diagnose whether an individual has autism spectrum 37 disorder. 38 "pharmacy care" means medications prescribed by a licensed health (v) 39 care provider legally authorized to prescribe under title eight of the 40 education law. 7 (x) "developmental, individual-differences, relationship-based treat-8 ment" means the implementation of a floortime intervention that is based 9 on an assessment of functional-emotional development and the person's 10 individual profile, while understanding that human development is 11 fostered in the context of relationships with others. The primary goal 12 is to promote development and address developmental challenges and defi-13 cits that often accompany autism and other neurodevelopmental disorders.

21 (B) Every group or blanket policy that provides physician services, 22 medical, major medical or similar comprehensive-type coverage shall 23 provide coverage for the screening, diagnosis and treatment of autism $\ensuremath{\mathsf{spectrum}}$ disorder in accordance with this paragraph and shall not 24 exclude coverage for the screening, diagnosis or treatment of medical 25 26 conditions otherwise covered by the policy because the individual is 27 diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder. No insurer shall terminate coverage or 39 refuse to deliver, execute, issue, amend, adjust, or renew coverage to 40 individual solely because the individual is diagnosed with autism an spectrum disorder or has received treatment for autism spectrum disor-41 42 der. Such coverage may be subject to annual deductibles, 10 copayments and coinsurance as may be deemed appropriate by the super-11 intendent and shall be consistent with those imposed on other benefits 12 under the contract. Coverage for applied behavior analysis and developmental, individual-differences, relationship-based treatment shall be 13 14 subject to a maximum benefit of six hundred eighty hours of treatment 15 per policy or calendar year per covered individual. This paragraph shall 16 not be construed as limiting the benefits that are otherwise available 17 to an individual under the contract, provided however that such contract shall not contain any limitations on visits that are solely applied to 18 19 the treatment of autism spectrum disorder. No insurer shall terminate 20 coverage or refuse to deliver, execute, issue, amend, adjust, or renew 21 coverage to an individual solely because the individual is diagnosed 22 with autism spectrum disorder or has received treatment for autism spectrum disorder. Coverage shall be subject to utilization review and 23 24 external appeals of health care services pursuant to article forty-nine 25 of this chapter as well as case management and other managed care provisions. 26

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(3) For purposes of this subsection:

(A) "autism spectrum disorder" means any pervasive developmental
