AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to hazing, serving alcohol to minors and illegal drug offenses

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 1 of section 6430 of the education law, as 2 amended by chapter 75 of the laws of 2004, is amended and a new subdivi-3 sion 7 is added to read as follows:

1. The trustees or other governing board of every college chartered by 4 the regents or incorporated by special act of the legislature and which 5 6 maintains a campus, unless otherwise provided, shall adopt written rules 7 for implementing all policies required pursuant to this article and for 8 the maintenance of public order on college campuses and other college property used for educational purposes and provide a program for the enforcement thereof. Such rules shall prohibit, among other things, any 9 10 11 action or situation which recklessly or intentionally endangers the 12 mental or physical health [or involves the forced consumption of liquor 13 or drugs for the purpose of initiation into or affiliation with any 14 organization] of any individual. Such rules shall govern the conduct of 15 students, faculty and other staff as well as visitors and other licen-16 sees and invitees on such campuses and property. The penalties for 17 violations of such rules shall be clearly set forth therein and shall include provisions for the ejection of a violator from such campus and 18 property, in the case of a student or faculty violator his or her 19 suspension, expulsion, or other appropriate disciplinary action, and in 20 the case of an organization which authorizes such conduct, recision of 21 22 permission for that organization to operate on campus property. Such 23 penalties shall be in addition to any penalty pursuant to the penal law 24 or any other law to which a violator or organization may be subject. 7. For the purposes of this article, organizations shall include, but 25

26 not be limited to, recognized college or student government organiza-27 tions or clubs, alumni organizations, athletic teams and clubs, frater-

2	that has access to and use of college facilities.
3	§ 2. Paragraphs a and c of subdivision 3 of section 6431 of the educa-
4 5	tion law, as amended by chapter 13 of the laws of 2009, are amended to read as follows:
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7	those persons who advise or supervise students, about sexual assault,
8	domestic violence, bias related crime, hazing, underage drinking, ille-
9	gal drug use, and stalking offenses pursuant to section sixty-four
10	hundred thirty-two, section sixty-four hundred thirty-eight-a, and
11	<pre>section sixty-four hundred thirty-eight-b of this article;</pre>
12	c. reporting sexual assaults, domestic violence, hazing, bias related
13	crime, and stalking incidents and assisting victims during investi-
14	gations;
15	§ 3. The education law is amended by adding two new sections 6438-a
16	and 6438-b to read as follows:
17	<u>§ 6438-a. Hazing information and prevention. 1. Each college shall</u>
18	adopt rules that prohibit conduct which intentionally or recklessly
19	involves the forced consumption of alcohol or drugs, or any other behav-
20	ior that may endanger the mental or physical health and safety of indi-
21	viduals.
22	2. Each college shall inform incoming students about prohibitions on
23	hazing through programs which may include workshops, seminars,
24	discussion groups and media presentations, in order to disseminate
25	information about hazing, promote discussion, encourage reporting of
26	incidents of hazing and facilitate prevention of such incidents. Such
27	information shall include, but not be limited to:
28	a. the applicable laws, ordinances and regulations regarding hazing,
29 30	including the penalties for violation under law;
30 31	b. the procedures and penalties in effect at the college for dealing with hazing; and
31 32	<u>c. the availability of counseling and other support services for the</u>
33	victims of hazing.
33 34	<u>3. Each college shall develop policies for the training of appropriate</u>
35	staff, including, but not limited to, resident life staff, coaches and
36	other personnel regarding hazing and the procedures for enforcing and
37	reporting such incidents to the proper college officials.
38	4. Each college shall review disciplinary procedures pertaining to all
39	organizations as defined by subdivision seven of section sixty-four
40	hundred thirty of this article. Such penalties may include, but not be
41	limited to, the revocation of such organization's right to operate on
42	such campus, use campus facilities or be recognized by the college or
43	university. Where such organization is a fraternity or sorority,
44	commonly identified as a Greek letter organization, such penalties may
45	include, but not be limited to, the withdrawal of the recognition of
46	such organization from such campus.
47	5. College rules may include provisions for the disciplinary action of
48	students who fail to report known instances of hazing and immunity from
49	college disciplinary action for good faith reporting of hazing.
50	§ 6438-b. Alcohol and drug abuse information and prevention. 1. Each
51	college shall inform incoming students about prohibitions on underage
52	drinking and substance abuse through programs which may include work-
53	shops, seminars, discussion groups and media presentations in order to
54	disseminate information about underage drinking and substance abuse,
55	promote discussion, and facilitate prevention of such incidents. Such
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56 <u>information shall include</u>, but not be limited to:

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T	a. the applicable laws, ordinances and regulations regarding underage
2	drinking and illegal drug use, including the penalties for violation
3	under law;
4	b. the procedures and penalties in effect at the college for dealing
5	with underage drinking and drug use; and
б	c. the availability of counseling and other support services for
7	substance abusers.
8	2. Each college shall develop policies for the training of appropriate
9	staff, including, but not limited to, resident life staff, coaches and
10	other personnel regarding underage drinking and drug and alcohol abuse
11	and the procedures for enforcing and reporting such incidents to the
12	proper college officials.
13	3. Each college shall review current disciplinary procedures pertain-
14	ing to all organizations as defined by subdivision seven of section
15	sixty-four hundred thirty of this article and may provide additional
16	penalties regarding illegal drug use and underage drinking.
17	§ 4. This act shall take effect on the first of July next succeeding

18 the date on which it shall have become a law.
