AN ACT to amend the penal law, the criminal procedure law and the correction law, in relation to eliminating mandatory minimums; to amend the sentencing reform act of 1995, in relation to the effectiveness thereof; to amend chapter 339 of the laws of 1972, amending the correction law and the penal law relating to inmate work release, furlough and leave, in relation to the effectiveness thereof; to amend chapter 435 of the laws of 1997, amending the military law and other laws relating to various provisions, in relation to the effectiveness thereof; to amend part E of chapter 62 of the laws of 2003, amending the correction law and other laws relating to various provisions, in relation to the effectiveness thereof; amend in the correction law and other laws relating to various provisions, in relation to the effectiveness thereof; amending the correction law and other laws relating to the laws of 1995, amending the correction law and other laws and other laws relating to the incarceration fee, in relation to the effectiveness thereof; and to repeal certain provisions of the penal law, the criminal procedure law and the correction law relating thereto

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1	Section 1. Subdivision 6 of section 1.05 of the penal law, as amended
2	by chapter 98 of the laws of 2006, is amended to read as follows:
3	6. To [insure the public] promote community safety by [preventing the
4	commission of offenses through the deterrent influence of the sentences
5	authorized, ] supporting the rehabilitation of [those] individuals who
б	have been convicted, [the promotion of] their successful and productive
7	reentry and reintegration into society, and [their] confinement only
8	when required [in the interests of public protection] in accordance with
9	subdivision three of section 60.03 of this chapter.
10	§ 2. The penal law is amended by adding a new section 60.03 to read as
11	follows:
12	<u>§ 60.03 Presumption against sentences of imprisonment.</u>
13	1. There shall be a presumption against sentences of imprisonment in

14 all cases which may be overcome only in extraordinary circumstances. The

15 term "sentence of imprisonment" means any sentence of incarceration.

EXPLANATION--Matter in <u>italics</u> (underscored) is new; matter in brackets [-] is old law to be omitted.

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1	2. For any felony, an authorized sentence includes a sentence other
2	than incarceration or a definite sentence of imprisonment. The court may
3	fix such authorized sentence for one year or less.
4	3. (a) Before imposing a sentence of imprisonment, the court shall
5	conduct a hearing to determine whether the presumption against incarcer-
б	ation has been overcome.
7	(i) In order to overcome the presumption against incarceration, the
8	prosecutor must show, by clear and convincing evidence, that there are
9	no means to address the unlawful behavior and promote community safety
10	<u>other than imprisonment.</u>
11	(ii) At the hearing the court shall consider oral and written argu-
12	ments, take testimony from witnesses offered by either party, and
13	consider relevant evidence to assist in making its determination,
14	including testimony and evidence admitted in prior proceedings in the
15	same case. Reliable hearsay shall be admissible at such hearing. Testi-
16	mony of witnesses relating to prior bad acts or convictions of the
17	defendant shall not be considered relevant to the court's determination.
18	(iii) The court shall detail its findings in writing, including an
19	individualized finding as to why the presumption has been overcome.
20	(iv) If the court finds that the presumption has been overcome, it
21	shall proceed to impose the minimum term of imprisonment necessary to
22	achieve the goals of sentencing.
23	(v) If a hearing is not held or the presumption has not been overcome
24	the court shall impose a non-incarceratory sentence unless the hearing
25	has been waived pursuant to subdivision five of this section.
26	(vi) A defendant shall not be required to pay for any part of the cost
20	of their sentence.

20 29	(vii) Upon request of the defendant, the court shall conduct the hear-
	ing promptly after the rendering of a guilty verdict or the entry of a
30	guilty plea.
31	(b) In considering whether the presumption against incarceration has
32	been overcome and, where relevant, what the appropriate incarceratory
33	sentence should be, the court shall consider the following:
34	(i) the unique harms of imprisonment, including interruption of
35	defendant's connections to family, employment, needed public benefits,
36	healthcare, and housing;
37	(ii) the financial cost of incarceration to the state and/or locali-
38	ties;
39	(iii) any mitigating circumstances that bear on the manner in which
40	the crime was committed; and
41	(iv) the history, character and condition of the defendant, including,
42	but not limited to:
43	(1) presence of physical or emotional trauma either direct or
44	witnessed;
45	(2) need for community-based treatment to address substance use,
46	mental health, and/or physical health issues;
47	(3) history of learning disabilities, below average IQ, academic
48	difficulty, or physical disability;
49	(4) history of familial disruption such as divorce, domestic violence,
50	sexual abuse, assault, drug or alcohol abuse, or involvement in the
51	criminal legal system;
52	<u>(5) age;</u>
53	(6) potential immigration consequences of sentence;
54	(7) lack of prior criminal record;
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- 55 (8) history of employment;
- 56 (9) lack of stable housing, education, or financial instability;

1	(10) vulnerability to abuse in prison, including evidence of past
2	victimization; and
3	(11) the factors set forth in subdivision one of section 60.12 of this
4	title.
5	(c) The court shall not consider or draw any negative inference from a
6	defendant's silence or failure to express remorse.
7	4. If a defendant testifies at the hearing, such testimony shall not
8	be admissible in any subsequent proceeding.
9	5. A defendant may knowingly and voluntarily waive their rights under
10	this section.
11	§ 3. Subdivision 1 of section 380.50 of the criminal procedure law, as
12	amended by chapter 307 of the laws of 1992, is amended to read as
13	follows:
14	1. The court shall impose sentence in accordance with the procedures
15	set forth in section 60.03 of the penal law. At the time of pronouncing
16	sentence, the court must accord the prosecutor an opportunity to make a
17	statement with respect to any matter relevant to the question of
18	sentence. The court must then accord counsel for the defendant an oppor-
19	tunity to speak on behalf of the defendant. The defendant also has the
20	right to make a statement personally in his or her own behalf, and
21	before pronouncing sentence the court must ask the defendant whether he
22	or she wishes to make such a statement.
23	§ 4. Paragraph (a) of subdivision 3 of section 390.30 of the criminal
24	procedure law, as added by chapter 14 of the laws of 1985, is amended to
