AN ACT to amend the real property tax law, in relation to expanding the real property tax exemption for persons with disabilities to property owners who are a parent or parents of an individual with a disability

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Paragraph (a) of subdivision 1 of section 459-c of the real
2 property tax law, as amended by chapter 348 of the laws of 2007, is
3 amended to read as follows:

4 (a) Real property owned by one or more persons with disabilities, or
5 real property owned by a husband, wife, or both, or by siblings, at
6 least one of whom has a disability, or real property owned by one or
7 more persons, some of whom qualify under this section and the others of
8 whom qualify under section four hundred sixty-seven of this title, and
9 whose income, as hereafter defined, is limited by reason of such disability,
10 shall be exempt from taxation by any municipal corporation in
11 which located to the extent of fifty per centum of the assessed valuation
12 thereof as hereinafter provided. After a public hearing, the
13 governing board of a county, city, town or village may adopt a local law
14 and a school district, other than a school district subject to article
15 fifty-two of the education law, may adopt a resolution to grant the
16 exemption authorized pursuant to this section. After a public hearing,
17 the governing board of a county, city, town or village may adopt a local
18 law and a school district, other than a school district subject to article
19 fifty-two of the education law, may adopt a resolution to grant an
20 exemption to real property owned by a parent or parents of an individual
21 with a disability who lives at such property when such individual's
22 disability requires regular significant spending of a parent or parents'
23 income to care for such individual, in accordance with this section.

24 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
