AN ACT to amend the workers' compensation law, in relation to presumptive evidence for individuals who participated in the World Trade Center rescue, recovery and clean-up operations

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- 1 Section 1. Section 161 of the workers' compensation law is amended by adding a new subdivision 5 to read as follows:
- 5. "Centers for Disease Control and Prevention World Trade Center
  Health Program Certification" shall be deemed to be presumptive medical
  evidence of a causally related diagnosis for an individual covered under
  this section.
- 7 § 2. The workers' compensation law is amended by adding a new section 8 169 to read as follows:
- 9 § 169. Presumptive evidence. Notwithstanding the provisions of any 10 general, special or local law or administrative code to the contrary,
- 11 any condition of impairment of health or death of an individual who
- 12 <u>files a workers' compensation claim under this article or a dependent of</u>
- 13 <u>a decedent who files a workers' compensation claim under this article</u>
- 14 shall be presumptive evidence that such condition of impairment of
- 15 <u>health or death was incurred as a result of such individual's partic-</u>
  16 <u>ipation in the World Trade Center rescue, recovery and clean-up oper-</u>
- 17 ations. Provided further, the board shall accept the certifications of
- 18 the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention World Trade Center Health
- 19 Program as presumptive evidence of causation of certified illnesses
- 20 pursuant to 42 USC 300mm.
- 21 § 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
