- Introduced by M. of A. McDONALD -- read once and referred to the Committee on Higher Education
- AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to authorizing tuition assistance program awards for students enrolled in short-term credential programs offered by certain public institutions

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1	Section 1. The education law is amended by adding a new section
2	667-c-2 to read as follows:
3	<u>§ 667-c-2. Short-term credential tuition assistance program awards. 1.</u>
4	Notwithstanding any law, rule or regulation to the contrary, the pres-
5	ident of the higher education services corporation is authorized to make
6	tuition assistance program awards to students enrolled in short-term
7	credential programs offered by the state university of New York (SUNY),
8	a community college established pursuant to article one hundred twen-
9	ty-six of this chapter, the city university of New York (CUNY), or a
10	board of cooperative educational services established pursuant to arti-
11	cle forty of this chapter, who meet all requirements for tuition assist-
12	ance program awards.
13	2. For purposes of this section, a short-term credential program is
14	one that:
15	a. provides not less than one hundred fifty, and not more than six
16	hundred, clock hours of instructional time over a period of not less
17	than eight weeks and not more than fifteen weeks;
18	b. provides training aligned with the requirements of high-skill,
19	high-wage, or in-demand industry sectors or occupations in the state, as
20	determined by the commissioner, in consultation with the department of
21	labor; and
22	c. provides a student, upon completion of the program, with a recog-
23	nized postsecondary credential that is recognized by employers in the
24	relevant industry, including credentials recognized by industry or
25	sector partnerships in the relevant industry in the state;
26	3. a. For students enrolled in a short-term credential program as
27	defined in this section, the award shall be calculated as provided in

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section six hundred sixty-seven of this article and shall be in an 1 amount equal to the enrollment factor percent of the award the student 2 would have been eligible for if the student were enrolled full-time at a 3 4 degree-granting institution or registered not-for-profit business school 5 qualified for tax exemption under section 501(c)(3) of the internal 6 revenue code for federal income tax purposes. The enrollment factor 7 percent is the percentage obtained by dividing the number of hours the 8 student is enrolled in, as certified by the school, by the number of 9 hours required for full-time study, at a degree-granting institution or 10 registered not-for-profit business school qualified for tax exemption 11 under section 501(c)(3) of the internal revenue code for federal 12 income tax purposes, for a semester, quarter, or term, as defined by the 13 commissioner. b. Any award a student receives pursuant to this section shall be 14 15 counted as the enrollment factor percent of a semester, quarter or term toward the maximum term of eligibility for tuition assistance awards 16 17 pursuant to section six hundred sixty-seven of this article. The total period of study for which payment may be made shall not exceed the 18
