AN ACT to amend the public health law and the education law, in relation to directing the commissioners of education and health to establish rules and regulations for the treatment and monitoring of students of school districts, boards of cooperative educational services and nonpublic schools who exhibit signs or symptoms of pending or increased risk of sudden cardiac arrest

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1	Section 1. Short title. This act shall be known and may be cited as
2	the "Dominic Murray sudden cardiac arrest prevention act".
3	§ 2. Section 206 of the public health law is amended by adding a new
4	subdivision 31 to read as follows:
5	31. The commissioner shall develop information that is reviewed by the
б	commissioner of education related to students who exhibit signs or symp-
7	toms of pending or increased risk of sudden cardiac arrest. Such infor-
8	mation shall include, but not be limited to, the definition of sudden
9	cardiac arrest, signs and symptoms of sudden cardiac arrest, and guide-
10	lines for a student's participation in interscholastic athletics after
11	exhibiting signs or symptoms of pending or increased risk of sudden
12	cardiac arrest. Such information shall be posted on the department's
13	website.
14	§ 3. The education law is amended by adding a new section 923 to read
15	as follows:
16	§ 923. Sudden cardiac arrest. a. The commissioner shall review the

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ing or increased risk of sudden cardiac arrest. Such information shall 1 2 be posted on the department's website. In addition, each school shall be 3 required to include such information reviewed by the department and 4 developed by the department of health in any permission form or parent 5 or person in parental relation consent form or similar document that may б be required for a student's participation in interscholastic athletics 7 and shall also include such information, or reference how to obtain such 8 information from the department and the department of health's websites, 9 on the school's website, if one exists. 10 b. The commissioner shall promulgate rules and regulations that 11 authorize school districts, in their discretion, to establish a sudden cardiac arrest management team. Such management team shall be composed 12 13 of an athletic director, a school nurse, a school physician, a coach of 14 the interscholastic team, an athletic trainer or other appropriate 15 personnel as designated by the school or school district. Provided 16 further, every sudden cardiac arrest management team may establish and 17 implement a program that annually provides information on sudden cardiac arrest to parents or persons in parental relation. In developing such 18 19 rules and regulations, the commissioner shall consider input from stake-20 holders and other interested parties including, but not limited to, 21 parents, teachers, students, school administrators, school athletic trainers, coaches, medical and health professionals, the public schools 22 athletic league (PSAL), the New York state public high school athletic 23 24 association (NYSPHSAA), and other athletic associations. § 4. Subdivision 1 of section 3001-b of the education law, as added by 25 26 chapter 498 of the laws of 1991, is amended to read as follows: 27 1. On and after the effective date of this section, in addition to any 28 provision of law or rule or regulation of the department related to the 29 requirements necessary for teachers within the public school systems, 30 whether certified in physical education or not, to coach any extra-class 31 athletic activity, it shall be required of such teachers, except as 32 provided in subdivision two of this section, to hold a valid certificate 33 of completion of a course of study in first aid knowledge and skills offered by [the American National Red Cross] a nationally recognized 34 organization, as defined in paragraph (d) of subdivision one of section 35 36 three thousand-b of the public health law and approved by the commis-37 sioner, or to meet equivalent requirements as certified by the commis-38 sioner. Any such course of study or equivalent requirements must include 39 instruction in recognizing signs and symptoms of pending or increased 40 risk of cardiac arrest and sudden cardiac arrest and the administration 41 of adult cardiopulmonary resuscitation. Prior to the start of each 42 sports season, coaches must provide valid evidence to their chief school 43 officer that their first aid and adult cardiopulmonary resuscitation knowledge and skills are current pursuant to the requirements estab-44 45 lished by [the American National Red Cross] a nationally recognized 46 organization, as defined in paragraph (d) of subdivision one of section 47 three thousand-b of the public health law or that they meet equivalent 48 requirements as certified by the commissioner. 49 § 5. Subdivision 1 of section 3001-c of the education law, as added by chapter 39 of the laws of 1994, is amended to read as follows: 50 1. On and after the effective date of this section, it shall be 51 52 required of coaches of high school extra-class athletic activities in a 53 nonpublic school system, except as provided in subdivision two of this 54 section, to hold a valid certificate of completion of a course of study 55 in first aid knowledge and skills offered by [the American National Red 56 **Cross**] a nationally recognized organization, as defined in paragraph (d)

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1 of subdivision one of section three thousand-b of the public health law and approved by the commissioner, or to meet equivalent requirements as 2 certified by the commissioner. Any such course of study or equivalent 3 4 requirements must include instruction in **recognizing signs and symptoms** 5 of pending or increased risk of cardiac arrest and sudden cardiac arrest and the administration of adult cardiopulmonary resuscitation. Prior to 6 the start of each sports season, coaches must provide valid evidence to their chief school officer that their first aid and adult cardiopulmo-9 nary resuscitation knowledge and skills are current pursuant to the requirements established by [the American National Red Cross] 10 nationally recognized organization, as defined in paragraph (d) of 11 subdivision one of section three thousand-b of the public health law or 12 that they meet equivalent requirements as certified by the commissioner.

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14 § 6. This act shall take effect on the first of July next succeeding the date on which it shall have become a law. Effective immediately, the 15 16 addition, amendment and/or repeal of any rule or regulation necessary 17 for the implementation of this act on its effective date are authorized 18 to be made and completed on or before such effective date.
