AN ACT to amend the insurance law, in relation to providing for health insurance coverage for diagnostic screening for colorectal cancer

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1	Section 1. Subsection (i) of section 3216 of the insurance law is
