AN ACT to amend the military law, in relation to the issuance of a New York State Vietnam War Service Medal

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 247 of the military law is amended by adding a new subdivision 1-d to read as follows:

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3 1-d. The adjutant general, subject to available appropriation authority or with funds otherwise available, is hereby authorized to present in 5 the name of the legislature of the state of New York, a medal, to be known as the "New York State Vietnam War Service Medal", bearing a suit-7 able inscription, to any person: (i) who is a resident of the state of New York; or (ii) who was a resident of the state of New York while 8 9 serving in the armed forces of the United States; (iii) who served in 10 the United States Armed Forces, defined as army, air force, navy, marine 11 corps, or coast quard, or the organized militia on active duty abroad in 12 the Vietnam War during the period of time from November first, nineteen hundred fifty-five through April thirtieth, nineteen hundred seventy-13 five; and (iv) who was honorably discharged or released under honorable 14 circumstances subsequent to such service. Not more than one New York 15 16 State Vietnam War Service Medal shall be awarded or presented, under the 17 provisions of this subdivision, to any person whose entire service 18 subsequent to the time of the receipt of such medal shall not have been honorable. For each succeeding star as provided herein, such person 19 shall be entitled to wear, as the chief of staff of the state may 2.1 direct, a ribbon whose color and design shall be selected by the divi-

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1 sion of military and naval affairs. In the event of the death of any person during or subsequent to the receipt of such certificate it shall 3 be presented to such representative of the deceased as may be desig-4 nated. The adjutant general, in consultation with the director of the division of veterans' affairs, shall make such rules and regulations as may be deemed necessary for the proper presentation and distribution of such medals.

- § 2. Subdivision 4 of section 247 of the military law, as amended by chapter 332 of the laws of 2018, is amended to read as follows:
- 4. This section shall not be construed to require that a recipient of the conspicuous service cross, the conspicuous service star, the Cold War Certificate [→], the New York State Silver Rose Veterans Service Certificate or the New York State Vietnam Service Medal has been a resident of the state of New York at the time of his or her entry into the United States army, air force, navy, marine corps, or nurses corps.
- § 3. This act shall take effect on the one hundred twentieth day after 17 it shall have become a law. The division of military and naval affairs 18 is authorized to promulgate any and all rules and regulations and take any other measures necessary to implement the provisions of this act on 19 20 its effective date on or before such date.
