AN ACT to amend the economic development law, in relation to establishing the New York state advisory council on coronavirus economic recovery and workforce development; and providing for the repeal of such provisions upon expiration thereof

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. The economic development law is amended by adding a new article 23 to read as follows:

## ARTICLE 23

## NEW YORK STATE ADVISORY COUNCIL ON CORONAVIRUS ECONOMIC RECOVERY AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

Section 455. New York state advisory council on coronavirus economic recovery and workforce development established.

§ 455. New York state advisory council on coronavirus economic recovery and workforce development established. 1. There is hereby created within the department the New York state advisory council on coronavirus economic recovery and workforce development for advising the department as provided in this section. The council shall concentrate both on 13 coronavirus economic recovery as well as issues impacting business post 14 recovery.

- 2. (a) The council shall consist of twelve members: three members 15 appointed by the temporary president of the senate, three members 16 17 appointed by the speaker of the assembly, and the six remaining members 18 appointed by the governor, at least two of which shall be small business 19 owners in the state who employ fifty or less employees.
- (b) The appointed council members shall represent various geographic 20 areas of the state and shall be knowledgeable in at least one of the 22 <u>following areas:</u>

- 2 (ii) education;
- 3 (iii) workforce development; or
- 4 (iv) public-private partnerships for economic recovery.
- 5 <u>3. The council shall make recommendations to the commissioner on</u> 6 <u>certain subjects including, but not limited to:</u>
- 7 (a) opportunities for collaboration between employers and educational institutions;
  - (b) strategies to address any skills gaps;
  - (c) strategies to create sustainable pathways into careers; and
- 11 (d) strategies for workplace learning and skills application.
- 12 4. The council shall meet as frequently as its business may require.

  13 The presence of a majority of the members shall constitute a quorum. The

  14 members of the council shall receive no compensation for their services

  15 as members.
- 5. The commission, upon request of the council, shall designate an officer or employee of the office to act as secretary of the council and shall assign from time to time such other employees as the council may require.
- 6. The council shall develop and submit a report to the governor, the speaker of the assembly, and the temporary president of the senate no later than one year from the effective date of this act and annually thereafter. Such report shall include recommendations required by this section and recommendations to effectively implement any initiative identified by the council.
- § 2. This act shall take effect immediately and shall expire and be deemed repealed four years after it shall have become a law.
