AN ACT to amend the agriculture and markets law, in relation to the Nourish New York program

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1	Section 1. The agriculture and markets law is amended by adding a new

8	§ 450. Declaration of legislative findings and intent. While the Nour-
	ish New York program was developed in response to disrupted food supply
10	chains due to the COVID-19 pandemic, it has emerged as an important
11	innovation, significantly supporting the state's farms while providing
	nourishing fresh foods to people experiencing food insecurity. The
13	<u>COVID-19 crisis unveiled the weaknesses in our state's food supply</u>
	system and has caused serious economic hardships for the state's farms
	and agribusinesses. But, in the ten months since its inception, Nourish
	New York has already strengthened the state's food supply network and
	expanded markets for New York farm products. The local food movement has
	also gained significant momentum during the pandemic, with increasing
	numbers of New Yorkers wanting to know where their food is sourced.
	This presents the state with a major opportunity to support our local
	economies and create greater equity in our food system by providing
	greater access to local, healthy options in food insecure areas through
	making the Nourish New York program permanent.

4	2. "Surplus agricultural products" means consumable or edible agricul-
5	tural products grown in New York but shall not include condiments,
б	sweeteners or beverages containing alcohol.
7	<u>§ 452. Nourish New York program. 1. The commissioner shall, to the</u>
8	extent permitted by state or federal appropriations for such purpose,
9	facilitate programming that ensures surplus agricultural products are
10	provided to food relief organizations at competitive wholesale prices.
11	2. The commissioner shall provide technical assistance and information
12	about the program to food relief organizations, producers of surplus
13	agricultural products and the public, including, but not limited to,
14	information posted on the department's website.
15	3. The commissioner shall provide means, which may include posting on
16	the department's website, for producers to make available surplus agri-
17	cultural products and for food relief organizations to access surplus
18	agricultural products.
