AN ACT to amend the general business law, in relation to disclosure of third-party food delivery service fees

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1	Section 1. The general business law is amended by adding a new section
2	396-rrr to read as follows:
3	§ 396-rrr. Third-party food delivery service fees. 1. Definitions.
4	For the purposes of this section, the following terms shall have the
5	following meanings:
б	(a) "Covered establishment" shall mean any food service establishment
7	that offers, either directly or through a third-party food delivery
8	service, in a single commercial transaction over the phone or internet,
9	the sale and same-day delivery of food and beverages to customers from
10	<u>one or more retail locations within the state.</u>
11	(b) "Food service establishment" shall mean any building, vehicle, or
12	structure, or any room or division in a building, vehicle, or structure
13	where food is prepared, served or sold for immediate consumption on or
14	in the vicinity of the premises, called for or taken out by customers,
15	or prepared prior to being delivered to another location for consump-
16	tion.
17	(c) "Online order" means an order placed by a customer through a plat-
18	form provided by a third-party food delivery service.
19	(d) "Purchase price" means the menu price of an online order, exclu-
20	sive of taxes, gratuities, and any other fees that may make up the total
21	<u>cost to the customer of an online order.</u>
22	(e) "Third-party food delivery service" means any website, mobile
23	application, or other internet service that offers or arranges for the
24	sale and same-day delivery or same-day pickup of food and beverages

3	2. Per-order fees. Every third-party food delivery service shall
4	disclose to customers the percentage of the purchase price of online
5	orders that is received by such service.
6	3. Penalties. Any third-party food delivery service which fails to
7	disclose their fees as required by subdivision two of this section shall
8	be subject to a civil penalty of not less than one thousand dollars per
9	violation.
10	4. Enforcement. The secretary of state may seek any relief available
11	under article sixty-three of the civil practice law and rules in a
12	proceeding against any person alleged to be in violation of this
13	section. In addition, the attorney general may bring an action on behalf
14	of the people of the state of New York to enjoin acts in violation of
15	this section and to recover any civil penalties unless civil penalties
16	have been previously recovered in such administrative proceedings.
17	5. Rules and regulations. The division of consumer protection, in
18	conjunction with the secretary of state, shall promulgate any rules and
19	regulations necessary to implement this section.
20	§ 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
