AN ACT to amend the labor law, in relation to authorizing service of notice by electronic communication

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 33 of the labor law, as amended by chapter 756 of the laws of 1975, is amended to read as follows:

2 § 33. Service of notice. [Whenever] Notwithstanding any other law, 3 rule, or regulation, whenever the commissioner or board or any person affected by the provisions of this chapter is required to give notice in writing to any person, such notice may be given by mailing it in a letter addressed to [such person at his] the last known place of business $[\frac{ex}{ex}]$ of such person, by delivering it to $[\frac{him}{ex}]$ the person personally, or by electronic communication with the consent of the 10 person. Notice to a partnership may be given to any of the partners [and], notice to a corporation may be given to any officer or agent 11 12 thereof, and notice to a limited liability company may be given to any 13 member or agent thereof, upon whom a summons may be served as provided 14 by the civil practice law and rules, or by electronic communication with 15 the consent of the entity. Consent for any entity may be provided by a partner, officer, agent, member, owner, or other similar individual. 16 Whenever an order or demand of the department is required to be served 17 shall be served in the manner hereinbefore provided for the service 18 19 of a notice [ex], by delivering it to any person of suitable age and discretion in charge of the premises affected by such order or demand, 21 or by electronic communication with the consent of the person, or if no person is found in charge by affixing a copy thereof conspicuously upon the premises. For the purposes of this section a person or entity shall 24 be deemed to have consented to electronic communication if they enrolled 25 or registered for electronic notice with the department.

§ 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
